HALIFAX, Nov 18—Nominations for bye-elections in four Counties for the local Legislature have been made. Angus A. Buchanan, Liberal, is elected by acclamation for Victoria County.

In Cumberland, there will be a three-cornered fight, the candidates being: Livingston, Liberal; Rogers, Conservative; and Landry, Labor.

In Lunenburg, McLean, Attorney General, Liberal, will be opposed by Margeson, Conservative. The candidates in Hants are Christie, Liberal, and Parsons, Conservative.

NEW STEAMERS TO BE BUILT.

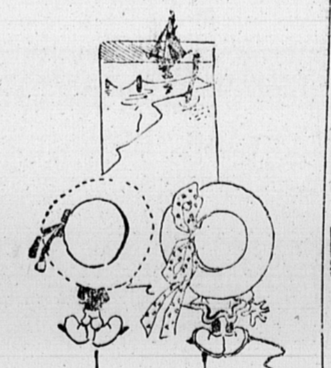
