NINETY-THREE KILLED IN TERRORIST ATTACKS

Programme Of Montgomery's Visit To Ch'town

Following is an outline of the programme of the visit of Field Marshal the Viscount Montgomery of Alamein, G.C.B., D.S.O., to Charlottetown on or about August 26:

1. Arrives Airport Charlottetown 11:30 a.m. Met by Lieutenant Governor and official party.
2. Drives from Airport to Provincial Building in open car, via Brackley Point Road, St. Peter's Road, Longworth Avenue, Boston Street, Great George Street, Grafton Street, Queen Street, Richmond Street, to 11:30 a.m.
3. Arrives at Provincial Building at 11:30 a.m. Guard of Honour notified by 17 (P.E.I.) Recce Regt. 11:30 to 11:40 a.m.
4. Inspects Guard of Honour.
5. Meets Premier, Chief Justice, Members of Charlottetown and Summerside, Ministers of Provincial Government and others, and distinguished visitors' register in Confederation Chamber, 11:40 to 12:10 noon.
6. Drives to assembly point in Victoria Park (field adjacent to Government House) via Richmond Street, Queen Street, Kent Street, and Park Roadway, 12:10 to 12:15 p.m.
7. Met by assembled veterans 12:15 to 12:45 p.m.
8. Official luncheon at Government House 12:45 to 2:30 p.m.
9. Drives from Government House to Airport via Kent Street, Great George Street, Boston Street, Longworth Avenue, St. Peter's Road and Brackley Point Road, 2:30 to 2:50 p.m.
10. Leaves Charlottetown by plane 2:50 p.m.

Mayor Will Not Resign

HAMILTON, July 22 (CP)—Mayor Sam Watrous of Hamilton said today in an interview that he would not resign his office as a result of the labor gathering here "where his name was used."

"I did not say 'I am a Labor man' and chief magistrate secondly as some reports state," declared the mayor. "What I did say was that I am going to speak secondly as your mayor and chief magistrate."

The Canadian Press, in its report of the meeting, erroneously stated that Mayor Lawrence "declared he was a labor man first and chief magistrate second."

The mayor said he had no intention of resigning. He suggested in a Toronto morning paper (Close Mail) editorial which commented on his Thursday speech, that he denied "violating" his oath of office or "inciting" anyone to strike or to be lawless.

Imperial Oil Officials On Visit To Province

Imperial Oil Ltd. officials are in Charlottetown on a visit to the province. Mr. Henry H. Hewitson, president of the company, and Mr. F. W. Pierce, chairman of the board, arrived yesterday.

Causeway To Link Cape Sable Island And Mainland

(By The Canadian Press) HALIFAX, July 23 (Tuesday)—A survey of the site of a causeway to be built across Barrington passage from Cape Sable Island to the Nova Scotia mainland now is underway and it is expected the contract for the \$400,000 project will be awarded before the end of the year. R. W. McCollough of the Department of Public Works announced today.

The causeway will give the town of Barrington on Cape Sable Island direct highway communication with the rest of the province. At present transportation is by a government operated ferry. Reconstruction and paving of the highway between Barrington Harbor and Barrington passage will follow when the causeway is completed, McCollough said.

Martial Law Declared After Hotel Bombing

JERUSALEM, July 22 (CP)—The Palestine government announced tonight that 93 persons, including 14 senior British and Palestinian officers, were killed, injured, or are missing under a "huge" bombing of the "Royal King David" hotel.

The official announcement of the deaths was made shortly after the Jewish agency expressed horror at the bombing and called upon the Jewish community in Palestine "to rise up against these abominable outrages."

Police attributed the attack to "Jewish terrorists."

Known casualties up to 9:30 p.m. included 12 senior British officers of the government secretariat and two senior Palestine officers of the army-general's department.

The blast, which ripped through the secretariat and the headquarters of the British army, destroyed 25 rooms and five floors and tore off a whole corner of the massive hotel.

When the body of a member of the British Army Medical Corps was brought out, several British soldiers were heard to say: "There'll be hell to pay about our girls."

A strict curfew was invoked immediately as all Jerusalem was placed under virtual martial law. Fully armed British soldiers, by the hundreds, accompanied by British carriers, moved through the streets of the city.

The attack came just 23 days and eight hours after the British army occupied the Jewish agency and arrested Jewish leaders, what was officially described as an "operation" designed to suppress activities in Palestine.

(In London the British cabinet authorized publication of a white paper detailing evidence which the government says links Jewish leaders with Palestine violence.)

The blast, described by a British officer as equivalent to the explosion of a 300-pound bomb, broke windows throughout Jerusalem and injured a number of persons some distance from the hotel.

Within minutes before the explosion the telephone operator at the King David received an anonymous call saying that the hotel was going to be blown up and advising her to "run for your life." The operator spread the alarm and the guests ran out of the building into the streets, but others used to be taken to the hospital.

While an excited crowd stood in the street outside the hotel, eight young men, six of whom were Arabs, appeared by a long corridor of the basement of the King David, and the crowd emerged from the kitchen and "everywhere" in the hotel. One British officer said the young men spoke Hebrew.

A number of the raiders ran into the basement of the hotel, where British army headquarters are situated. They threw a large quantity of explosive and approximately 90 seconds after they had fled the terrorist attack appeared.

Whether all of the group escaped the explosion is not known, but six of the raiders were seen to jump into a waiting automobile.

British Troops Distribute Bread In Northern Ireland

LONDON, July 22 (CP)—British troops distributed bread delivery workers voted against a week's strike.

The "roundmen's rebellion," three-fourths of the six counties of the population, was the only widespread resistance to the rationing, which caused comparative slight confusion in England, Scotland and Wales on its first week-day of operation.

A few store clerks quit their jobs, some housewives shopped late to get bread, and in London a young woman queuing for ration information fainted before the eyes of Food Minister Sirachy.

As he toured the crowded East End to see how the program was working.

Food officials said troops would carry bread tomorrow to rural areas where deliveries were being made along with the Belfast area workers in their protest against the rationing—clipping coupons and keeping records.

The rioting in most of the United Kingdom were shorter than on Saturday when housewives in the north of England hoarded bread for several days.

British White Paper Links Jewish Leaders With Palestine Violence

(By The Associated Press) BERLIN, July 22 (Tuesday)—The last command conference has been held and everything is in readiness for the underwater atomic bomb test scheduled for Thursday morning (Wednesday afternoon, Canadian time).

The final preparations included completion of the task of submerging six submarines in the target fleet and the holding of a routine electronics rehearsal.

Submerging the submarines, a two-day task, was the final act in dispersing the fleet of target vessels whose hulls are to be submitted to the terrific force of the underwater explosion.

There was a chance that the test might be delayed by an interruption of the weather. However, the weather demands for "Baker" day (Thursday) are far less exacting than they were for "Able" day, when the atomic air explosion test was held. This has nothing to do with the actual dispersing of the fleet, but the charge of the underwater bomb, which is to be suspended beneath a special raft or float. On July 1 (Able day) the atomic bomb was dropped from a B-29.

Labor Candidate Defeats Opponent

(By The Canadian Press) OTTAWA, July 22—Labor Minister Mitchell today gave the Commons these three reasons why national registration cards, issued during the war, still were in use:

1. So that the registration card still is being supplied may be known as to date as possible.
2. The certificates still are being used for identification purposes by the National Employment Service and other government agencies.
3. To assist the authorities in clearing up unfinished cases and investigations of desertions from the armed forces, defaults and delinquencies under the National Resources Mobilization Regulations, the Defence of Canada Regulations and other wartime controls.
