The members of the staff of the C. P. R. district passenger agents' staff and all the C. P. It is estimated that about 1200 tons of cheese and 250 tons of butter will represent the dairy output of the Province this year. The average price of cheese was about 11 1/2 cts. and at the last sale for the season a few weeks ago, 12 1-10 cts. were paid. The cheese factories have closed down, and butter making is now in full swing. The price for creamery butter is from 26 cts. to 27 cts., and the prospects for winter butter making were never better. The value of the cheese exported for the year will amount to about \$280,000, and of butter about \$135,000.

The following taken from the St. John Sun will be of interest in this Province. The Rev. Jesse Whitlock, one of the many honored ministers of the Methodist Church who have come from "The Garden of the Gulf," celebrated the 84th anniversary of his birth on the 3rd ult. at his home in Toronto. Mr. Whitlock has, during his sixty-five years of ministerial life, filled important circuits in P. E. Island and Ontario, and been rendered very useful. His wife, now in her 83rd year, was the daughter of the late Rev. Francis Metherall, for many years before the union of the Methodist bodies, General Superintendent of the Bible Christian Church on the Island. The occasion was suitably remembered by the members of the Parliament Street Methodist Church, to which they belong, by the presentation of an address, a Morris chair to Mr. Whitlock and a Morris chair to his wife, with good wishes for their happiness. 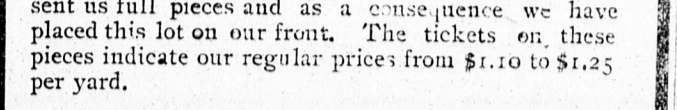

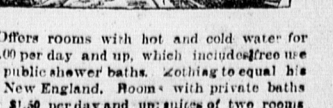
