WILL OF LATE HON. D. FARQUHARSON.

The last will and testament of the late Hon. Donald Farquharson was filed at the Probate office yesterday. The estate is made up as follows: Real Estate \$18,080.00; Mortgages and Judgments 35,937.00; Stocks, etc. 9,486.38; Promissory Notes 7,281.28; Book Debts 5,847.57; Household Furniture 1,005.45; Total \$77,637.63.

The executors of the will are, his wife, Sarah Farquharson, two of the children, Fannie E. Farquharson and Charles A. Farquharson and Colonel F. S. Moore. The will reads as follows: Know all men by these presents that I, Donald Farquharson of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, member of the House of Commons, Ottawa, being of sound mind and memory, do make and publish this my last will and testament.

And whereas I am seized and possessed of an estate, varied in its nature, and which I trust will be carefully and judiciously managed by those to whom I am committing it, may God give them strength so to do.

First—I hereby confirm a deed of the property on Upper Prince Street, which I made over to my dear wife under date of Sept. 19, 1893. This property with all the dwellings, in one of which we live, I hereby give her during her life time. This is in lieu and in full settlement of dower. At her decease this property shall be divided between my children in the same proportion as my present estate.

I also order that my wife shall have the use of furniture, horses, carriages, etc, etc to be used jointly with such of my children as may choose to remain on the household and unmarried and subject to the conditions to follow.

I also direct that each year after my decease there shall be paid to my dear wife the sum of twelve hundred dollars (\$1200.00) per year out of my estate, such payments to be made quarterly. The same to be derived from the property from houses on the grounds called Sep. 1895 shall form part of this \$1200.00 per year. The balance being received from the estate. Any of my unmarried children who may choose to remain on the household, can do so, where they may have board and lodging and clothing themselves they have means for that purpose.

Second—To my eldest daughter Laura I give the sum of \$5 she now being considerably provided for.

Third—To my oldest son, Richard Seymour and to his wife Julia, and to each of his three children, Mildred, Beatrice, and Doris, I bequeath the sum of \$1000 being \$300 in all. Also to each of these three children in addition to the above to be paid about ten years after my decease and to bear interest to Mildred \$300.00, to Beatrice \$300.00 and to Doris \$300.00.

Should the father, Richard Seymour be out of work then the interest only on this first five thousand dollars at 4% shall be used to support the family. Under other conditions where he has employment the interest only on two thousand dollars shall be used by the parents, the

Should a new Zion Church be constructed in this city instead of the present structure I order to be paid as my contribution the sum of \$2000. Also should a new Sabbath School be erected costing say \$1000 I order and bequeath the sum of \$800. This last amount, when being expended shall be under the supervision of Professors Cyrus McMillan and Robertson or either of them.

To the order of Foresters Court Avondale Charlottetown. I order to be paid the sum of \$25. For the enforcement of the Prohibitory law in Charlottetown I order to be paid to the committee appointed to receive the same the sum of \$100.

To the P. E. I. Hospital in this city I order to be paid the sum of \$200 dollars and to the Charlottetown Hospital the sum of \$50.

Should a school for the education of street and neglected children be erected in this city, I order that my contribution shall be the interest or proceeds of \$2000 per annum being my proportion for the support of an education of say fifteen children.

Whereas I have for several years been managing the estates of the late George Farquharson as administrator and guardian, in which work I was kindly assisted by Judge Hodgson, I take this opportunity of thanking. The work I performed as above was gratuitous on my part never having to my knowledge charged one cent. I also when paying the debts due by the late estate paid Davies and Hazard a mortgage due Dr. Dawson of \$5,000 and interest taking no assignment. This money is still due me with all other amounts which I paid. Besides this I paid A. A. McLean the Taylor mortgage \$800 with interest. This amount also I never received but for which I hold an assignment and are to-day due me.

And whereas the Stewart farm was sold by the Sheriff in order to secure a title and also in order to repay me \$750 which I loaned the late George Farquharson, the farm at the sale being purchased by me is still in my name and the part of it now remaining can pass to the estate of George Farquharson at any time on payment of the amounts as recited above, with interest at four per cent.

I also give and bequeath to each of the five children now on the farm of the late George Farquharson, viz, Seymour, Ada, Wallace, Cyrus, and May the sum of \$200 being \$1000 in all. This bequest goes to liquidate the amount due me by this estate, see my accounts Ledger F.

The residue of my estate to be divided several years hence shall be in proportion as now adopted unless unanimously decided otherwise by my executors. I also order and direct that a reasonable amount shall be given each year to the deserving poor for the purchase of coal and other necessities.

My executors are also charged with the payment of the following amounts to the following persons, to be paid in a reasonable time after my decease without interest except otherwise stipulated. To my brother James the interest on \$1000 per annum during the life of myself and wife. To Ada and May, daughters of the late George Farquharson, the sum of \$25.00 each; and to each of the three brothers, Seymour, Wallace, and Cyrus, the sum of \$100.00. To Mrs. Morrow's child \$25.00, and to Albert Farquharson's child \$25.00. To the two children of the late John Thomas Farquharson the sum of \$25.00 each; to Mrs. J. A. Stewart of Westville \$20.00, and to her daughter Bessie \$20.00, to Baby Taylor and Baby Norton the sum of \$10.00.

I also bequeath to the Y. M. C. A. of this city the sum of \$100.00 to be paid to the proper officer appointed to receive the same.

I order that as compensation to Colonel F. S. Moore as executor of this my last will be paid the sum of \$100.00 in full.

As executors of this my last will and testament I hereby appoint my wife, my daughter Fannie Eliza, F. S. Moore, Colonel of this city and my son Charles Arthur. In witness whereof I the said Donald Farquharson set my hand and seal hereto this—day of May one thousand nine hundred and three.

Signed, sealed, published and declared by the said Donald Farquharson as and for his last will and testament in presence of us who in his presence and in the presence of each other and at his request have subscribed our names as witnesses.
