MONTREAL, May 12—(CP)—Most indices showed rises after day's trading on the stock exchange and curb market. Deals, however, were light. On the stock exchange industrials attracted most patronage. Firms were Dooco "B" Bathurst, United Steel and Celanese. Behind a little were St. Lawrence Paper preferred, Canadian Car preferred and Dooco "A" preferred. Building Products moved from the win to the loss column. Shawinigan showed a small profit in utilities and Canada Steamship preferred was also stronger. International Nickel did better in metals for a while and Imperial was improved in oils. Total sales: 9,800 shares; Industrials, 8,100; Mines, 1,700.

NEW YORK, May 12—(AP)—The recovery swing met opposition in today's market and leaders generally backed away from fractions to a point or so.

Canadian stocks were mixed. McIntyre and Lake Shore Mines each gained 1-2 point, Imperial Oil 3-8 and Deme 1-8. International Nickel declined 3-8. Canadian Pacific 1-8 and Hiram Walkers 1-4. Unchanged was Brazilian Traction. The Associated Press average of 60 issues was off 2 of a point at 34. Shares totaled 249,200 shares compared with 290,650 the day before.

Republic Steel dipped 1-8 points to a new 1942 low when directors declared a 25 cent dividend against 50 cents paid in April. Conservation of working capital for possible wage and tax emergencies was the reason given for the cut.

In new low ground for the year were Bath Iron Works, Philco Corp., General Steel Castings preferred and N.Y. Air Brake.

Lowered included U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown Sheet, American Can, Westinghouse, General Foods, Pepsi-Cola, Douglas Aircraft, U.S. Rubber, Chrysler, General Motors, Great Northern, Du Pont, Kennecott, Texas Co. and Standard Oil (NJ).

Holding small plus marks were American Telephone, American Smelting, Dow Chemical, Celanese, Lewis, American Tobacco "B", Standard Brands, Sears Roebuck, Philip Morris and Phelps Dodge.

- Anyone who buys more than is necessary for current needs - Is breaking his country's law for personal advantage. Is betraying his loyal neighbours and those who are not so well off as he. Is, in effect, depriving our fighting men of the munitions and supplies they must have to defend us. Is hindering our war effort and helping our enemies.

Loyal citizens avoid putting unnecessary and abnormal strains on our factories. In time of war, loyal citizens do not spend one dollar more on civilian goods than is absolutely necessary for current needs.

The law provides for fines up to \$5,000 and imprisonment up to two years for hoarding; and hoarding is just another word for unnecessary selfish buying.

In cases where it is advisable for you to buy in advance of your immediate requirements - such as your next season's coal supply - you will be encouraged to do so by direct statement from responsible officials.

Livestock

MONTREAL, May 12—(CP)—There were 136 cattle, 32 sheep and lambs, 654 hogs and 1,857 calves for sale on the two Montreal live stock markets today. Sows were easier, other kinds of livestock were steady to firm. Two carloads of steers were just received. The balance of the cattle were mostly cows. Butcher cows ranged from \$6.25 to \$9. Canners and cutters \$5 to \$6. Common bulls \$6 to \$8.25. Veal calves ranged from \$8.50 to \$13. Good veals were \$12 up. Medium kinds \$11 to \$11.50 and the veals were sold in mixed lots at \$9 to \$9.50. Drinks and light grassers were \$7 to \$8.25. Yearlings \$8 to \$7. Spring lambs were \$6 to \$10 each according to weight and quality. Common light lambs are not wanted. Sheep were \$5.50 to \$7.50. Hogs were \$15.35 to \$16.50 for B-1 dressed. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Sows were easier at \$9 to \$9.50 live weight.
