BRIEF BACKGROUND IN THE CAREERS OF CANADA'S CAPTAINS IN WAR



**HUGH DAY SCULLY**  
Chairman, War-time Industries Control Board

Hugh Day Scully takes his slogan for today from the words of Winston Churchill—"First, win the war, and don't take your eyes off that job looking far ahead toward where we are going afterward." He is well aware, however, that the machinery he is creating and causing to function today may have a vastly important and effective place in the Canada of tomorrow.

Mr. Scully, Commissioner of Customs in the Dominion Government, has been given the special wartime post of Controller of Steel and Chairman of the Board of Controllers of Industry. Canada thus stepped up to the line, met the challenge of Nazi dictated warfare by creating a central control of war industry and indirectly of all industry that bids fair to prove as strong and effective as anything Hitler can evolve in his excessively repellent methods, with the essential difference that control of the central centre and direction of its policy remain in the hands of the duly elected representatives of the Canadian people.

Hugh Scully is a Toronto man, born and educated in that city in its private and public schools and a graduate of its University. His father was a manufacturers' agent for British firms.

The Political Science course attracted Scully at "Varsity, it was considered a good foundation for law, which he intended to tackle later. In his second year he took the Silver Medal, in his third, the Gold Medal, and in the final year the Fellowship, each of those honours indicating he stood tops in his class.

On recommendation of one of his professors he took his first post with the Canadian Manufacturers Association, whom he served as Secretary for nine years. In those days the C.M.A. was a great force in Canada, its annual meetings and executives forming virtually a parliament of industrialists, who themselves were big personalities, men who had pioneered their own business and owned them.

In 1916 Scully went to Russell Motor Company as Secretary and Assistant General Manager, which gave him direct experience in conditions and problems of industry at war, as his firm was the principal manufacturer in Canada of time and graze fuses. He became also a director of Canada Cycle and Motor Co. Ltd.

Stewart, Scully and Co. Ltd. came into existence in 1922, organized by two ex-secretaries of the C. M. A., a firm of underwriters for small industrialists and construction propositions.

Mr. Scully first entered the service of the Government as Commissioner of Excise in 1932 when The Hon. E. B. Ryckman was Minister of National Revenue. His present post of Commissioner of Customs is a "hot spot", a firing line job. Continuous streams of individuals, groups, committees flow through his office, always bringing possible trouble in their wake, their object either to make a complaint or seek a concession. He is the country's "sentinel" in the field of industry.

As Chairman of the Board of Controllers of Industry, Mr. Scully administers a clearing house for common problems. Policy of all is

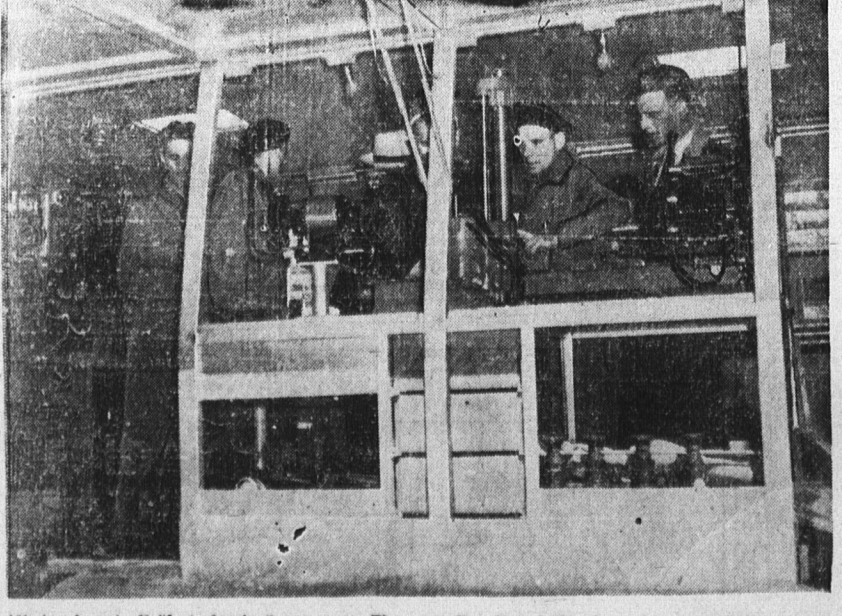
