The Victoria, B. C. Daily Times refers to the offer of the Premier to hand over the Pacific Great Eastern Railway "to the Federal Government and adds:

Hon. Mr. Kennedy would experience some difficulty in refraining from reciving Mr. Oliver's suggestion with his tongue in his cheek. None the less everybody in this Province will sympathize with the leader of the Government in his dilemma about the future of the road. At the present time it represents an outlay of something like forty millions and absorbs more than a couple of millions a year in interest and losses in operation. To take it to its originally planned destination would require anywhere from thirty-five to forty millions more. Add to this the doubt about its reaching a paying basis even when the Peace River shall be connected with the Pacific coast by this route and it is not difficult to understand why the authorities at Ottawa were "very non-committal."

who died in 1919, from an illness brought on by overwork. He left a male heir, his only child being the daughter, wife of Sir Humphrey Mackworth.
Lord Donoughmore presided over the committee, composed of Lords Desart, Haldane, Chelmsford Hyton Wrenbury, Phillmore, and Askwith.

Council Presents Case
After Lady Rhondda's right to the present title was established, her counsel argued that the Disqualification of Sex Act had clearly applied to a case like the present and that the disability existing in the past now being removed, Lady Rhondda was entitled to sit in the House of Lords.
After further argument, the At-

orney General, on behalf of the Crown, said he raised no objection to the petition, which was therefore granted.
Lady Rhondda thus becomes the first woman to sit in the House of Lords.
Interviewed after the decision, Lady Rhondda expressed her delight that the case had gone in her favor.
