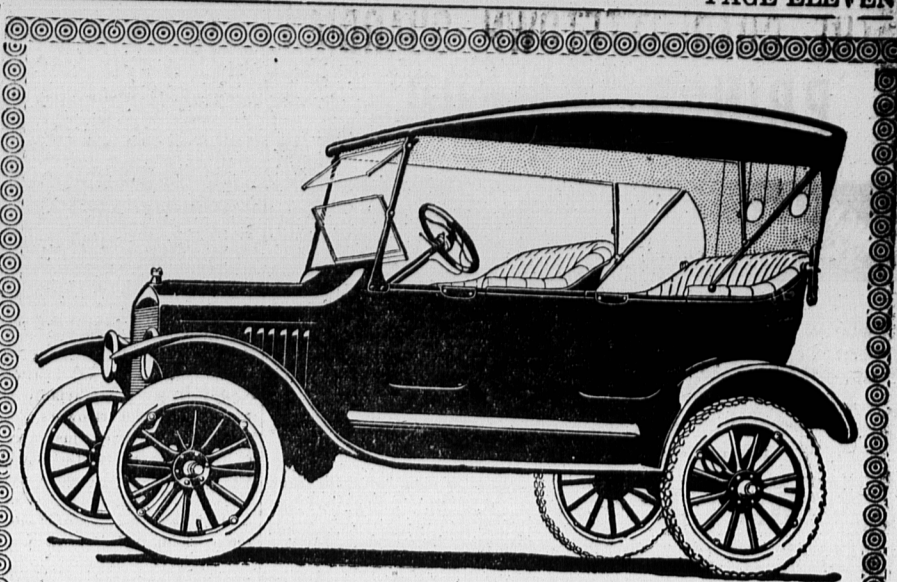

CLASHES IN INDIA

LONDON, Sept. 27.—Reuters correspondent in Simla, India reports serious collisions between British troops and native police at a bazaar at Maliana in the united provinces, on Saturday last. 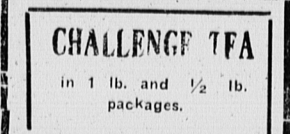

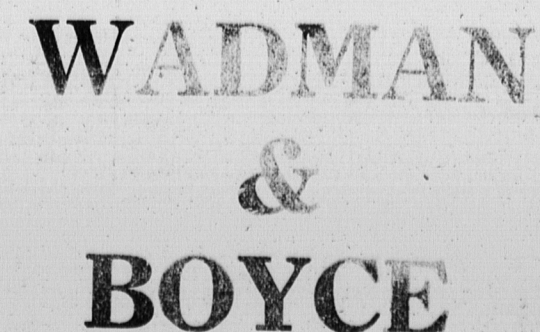
