promised would end only in "unconditional surrender."

Each gave unstinting praise to good neighbor policy, apparently projecting it into the future as a possible foundation on which permanent world concord might be built.

Discuss Many Things

There was no definite hint in the addresses which were broadcast, as to what specific matters had been discussed in the hours since Mr. Roosevelt arrived by special train from Texas late in the day.

The reference to exploitation obviously was directed at an old source of American-Mexican friction—American oil properties in Mexico which the Mexican Government expropriated.

"We desire a living together, free of the perpetual threats which derive from those who seek supremacy in the domestic field which—as we were able to note during the period in which this war was preparatory to the constructive capacity of ideals."

Purged Past Differences

Apparently willing to let differences of the past be forgotten Avila Camacho declared at another point.

"To effect, neither your Excellency nor I believe in negative memories because we both place our hope in the soundness of principles, in the perfectibility of men and in the constructive capacity of ideals."

The Presidents told of wartime co-operation across the border, with Mexico funneling vital war supplies and essential minerals into American arms plants and sending her people to the United States to help work the farms.

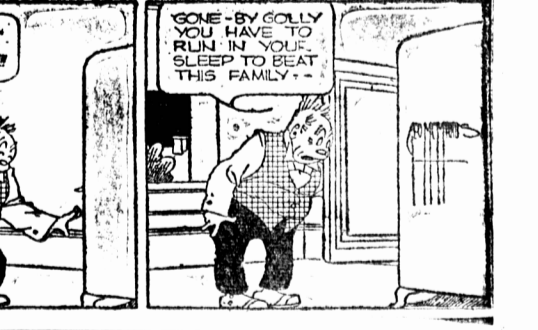
