On motion of Hon. Mr. McPhee the bill to further amend an Act to promote the improvement of highways was read a third time and passed.

The Church Property Commission On motion of Mr. Tanton the bill to amend the United Church of Canada Act was read a second time and committed. Mr. Pope in the chair. This bill repeals the Act passed last year appointing Neil McLeod, K.C., Kenneth M. Martin and H. James Palmer a Commission to settle differences between the United Church of Canada and the Continuing Presbyterian Church as to church property because they were unable to function, and enacts that the said Commissioners shall be known as the Prince Edward Island Church Property Commission, the said H. James Palmer to be chairman. The Commission may engage clerical assistance, and the expense thereof, and other proper expenses of the Commission, including the incidental and travelling expenses of the chairman shall be paid, one half, by the United Church and one-half by the Presbyterian and Prince Edward Island representing the aforesaid Continuing Presbyterians; and the said Commission shall determine in every case how and in what manner such Church Properties or property shall be allocated so as to render substantial justice, having regard to all the equities. The bill was reported agreed to with amendments.

The House then adjourned until 10 o'clock on Wednesday.
