ITALIAN FRANCHISE REFORM.

(Boston Transcript.) The scheme of suffrage reform which the Italian Government has brought forward is intended to sweep away all qualifications for voting except the educational. Male citizens of age who can read and write will have their names placed on the voting list. The change will be in one sense revolutionary, for heretofore the right of literates to vote has been dependent upon the payment either of a certain sum in direct tax or of rents graded with regard to the population of the commune. The result of the reform with regard to direct taxation has not been excessive, \$4 per annum being sufficient, but the burden of tenant farmers to pay \$100 in rent has been severely felt.
