THE TROUBLE IN MOROCCO.

Morocco lies in Northwestern Africa, and is separated from Spain in Europe by the Straits of Gibraltar. Its area is quoted as 410,000 square miles and the population of Moors, Berbers and Jews numbers some eight or nine millions. The Mohammedan faith is dominant and the Sultan is the spiritual as well as the civil head of the state, ruling with despotic power. There are two capital cities, Fez (140,000) and Morocco (50,000). Casa Blanca the scene of the recent bombardment, lies on the Atlantic coast some 300 miles S. W. from Gibraltar.

The trouble arising from the hopeless failure of the Sultan's Government to maintain order, thus permitting the fanatical Arab tribesmen in the mountainous interior to periodically plunder and slay whom they will. These true sons of Ishmael, turn their spears against helpless Moors, Christians and Jews with merciless impartiality. The Sultan has a standing army, but has been in the habit of making terms with the tribesmen, and the commander in chief of the Moroccan forces, Kaid Malassa, is now a captive, held for ransom by the head chief Rahmat.

It may be doubted whether a more lawless population exists on earth than the hill tribes of Morocco, and over their lawlessness the Sultan has made no effort to exercise a civilized restraint. The bombardment of Casa Blanca by the French and Spanish forces, primarily for the purpose of driving out the marauders and pillaging tribesmen, necessarily involved a slaughter of many of the Moorish inhabitants who were being pillaged and murdered. These same Moors, only less lawless than the Arabs, have been themselves ready enough to plunder and murder Europeans.

All the facts go to show that France has undertaken a difficult and almost hopeless task in the attempt to restore and maintain some semblance of order in Morocco. Very probably the work cannot be effected without a considerable armed force sufficient to conquer the hill tribes, and thereafter the maintenance of an armed occupation of the country similar to that maintained by Britain in Egypt.

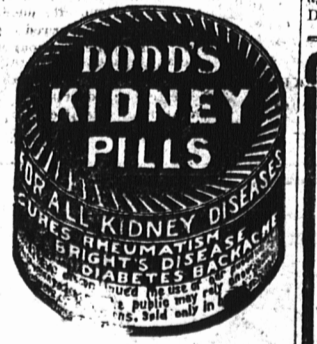
Chalariokorn, King of Siam is traveling in Europe and varies the social incidents of his visits to Christian Empress and Kings by extensive purchases of jewelry. He paid \$75,000 for a diamond the other day, a golden trifle he studied with great care. He has already bought \$8,000,000 worth of diamonds, gold and silver ware in London, Paris and other cities. Two of the gold services in his collection cost \$600,000 each. Just now he is exhibiting in Berlin where the Kaiser has lodged him in a palace large enough to keep his purchases on view. Thus still "the purple east with gorgeous hand showers on her flags barbaric pearl and gold."

A MAGICAL CITY.

The United States Steel Corporation, having need of a site for a new and immense steel producing plant, bought a large tract of land on the shore of Lake Michigan across the lake from the City of Chicago. There was a natural harbor there which has been improved. The corporation set aside the sum of \$75,000,000 to build their plant and the City of Gary, Indiana as the new steel plant, must needs employ tens of thousands of workmen and these and their families must be housed, the plans were laid out for a city of 300,000 inhabitants. Work was begun two years ago and today there is a large city there on what was then an arid, sandy plain. The main street, Broadway, has been constructed for a length of three miles and for two miles of that distance it has new pavements and sidewalks of concrete and is lined with fine business blocks ready for the dealers who are to occupy them.

By the first of October a population of 30,000 will be provided for, with residences, markets, banks, stores, hotels, electric and gas lighting, water supply, sewerage and all modern improvements. The City of Gary will presently begin its municipal life as a large community, sprung into life overnight, as one might say, and yet quite solid and substantial in every way. Its rapid growth seems assured. The Steel Corporation has announced that it will shortly spend an additional \$15,000,000 to the \$75,000,000 first devoted to the upbuilding of Gary, making \$120,000,000 in all. Thus in a brief space a great city will be created as complete, as populous and as wealthy as many that have taken a hundred years to grow. It is one of the marvels of the industrial age in which we live.

A British consul in Denmark reports to the Home Government that a Danish engineer has succeeded in producing beer in the form of tablets that can be carried in the pocket and which will give, presumably, the same exhilarating effect as the beverage itself. The announcement gives a hint of new difficulties in the prohibitory legislation of the future. It also serves to recall the fact that a religious body in one of the sister Provinces once solemnly denounced "the use of tobacco as a beverage." The temperance organisations may yet have to pledge their membership against intoxicating solids as well as liquids.



The Two Hundred Thousand Club is to be commended for undertaking to afford information in regard to farm properties for sale and persons who desire to purchase the same. The Maritime Board of Trade met, in St. John August 21, 22. The Island portion of the program includes the matters of freight and passenger rates, local and through express rates, cold storage on all subsidized steamers, readjustment of the fishery bounty and the construction of the Tunnel. It is a large and important bill of fare so far as this Province is concerned, and no doubt it will be capably presented by our delegates.
