Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency, or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.
Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres, or certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.
In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre.
Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.
The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

A PEACE PREPARATION FOR CANADA

OUTLINE I. MOTIVES II. METHODS III. EFFECT

I. Britain is at present engaged in the most gigantic struggle that has ever taken place in the history of the World. She is fighting for the protection of small nations, the safeguarding of international interests, and the establishment of the world's peace on a true and solid foundation. It is therefore the duty of all her colonies to make every sacrifice in order that she may bring this war to a successful issue.

For the past three years England's production has been steadily decreasing, and by incessant submarine warfare waged against her, she has lost enormously in tonnage and transport. This loss cannot be easily replaced, as the greater number of her sons, who formerly engaged in agricultural pursuits at home, are now fighting in the trenches; and her iron and steel previously used in shipbuilding, are now needed for the manufacture of munitions. Canada is in a position to build ships, if she had sufficient ready money to carry on the work. But although immensely rich in her natural resources, most of which are yet undeveloped, she cannot dispense with the pecuniary assistance of her people. This she is endeavouring to obtain in the form of loans, payable at the end of the war. It is therefore the

FOUND GUILTY OF CONSPIRING TO RESTRAIN TRADE AND BLACKLISTING DEALERS.

BOSTON.—Five officials and agents of the Aroostook Potato Shippers' Association, who were found guilty of conspiring to restrain trade in this commodity under the Sherman Act, have been fined a total of \$3,500 in the federal court. 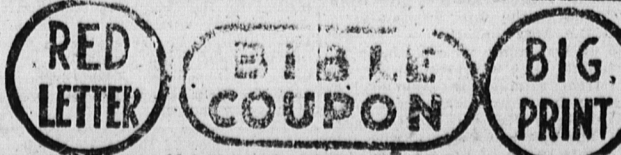
