

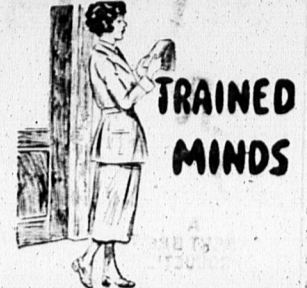

BEATING THE LAW.

The story of Russel Scott, the Chicago murderer, sentenced to death, thrice reprieved and finally discharged as "not guilty" because of insanity is familiar, too familiar, to all who read reports of murders and executions.

Chicago, the scene of the crime and of the trial, has a record of a little more than one murder a day. Is it any wonder? Looking over the criminal records of the world, it will be found generally that the number of crimes in any country bears a close relation to the manner in which the law is enforced.

Great Britain has the lowest criminal record of any country in the world and the reason is not far to seek. There the law is enforced. Murder is murder and once the courts have established the fact that it is murder, there is no escape.

It is no disgrace to be a criminal provided the criminal escapes jail or penitentiary or the scaffold. The punishment is the measure of the crime.

If we are to become a law-abiding nation, where life and property shall be safe, we must respect the law, not only the law that prescribes capital punishment, but the law which prescribes the simplest fine or the shortest term of imprisonment.

THE RUHR EVACUATION.

The French army has completed the evacuation of the Ruhr region and a cause of disturbance has been removed from the European situation. The occupation has lasted two years and a half. It was in effect an act of war, designed to compel Germany to fulfill the terms she accepted in accord with the Versailles treaty.

Notes By The Way

Election day in New Brunswick. Nobody knows how it is going, but there is intense interest in the result and the prospects are that a very large vote will be recorded.

Many things have changed in the complexion of parties in the past five years. In the election of 1920 Hon. W. E. Foster of Saint John was the Premier and leader. He resigned in 1923 and Hon. P. J. Veniot was chosen to succeed him.

In some counties the dominant issue is the administration of the crown lands, while in others it is the non-enforcement of the prohibition law, while in all parts of the Province the proposed expenditure of many millions to develop electric power is kept to the front.

Deep sea fishing is becoming an attraction to many visitors to the province and quite a number of them have taken advantage of the kindness of fishermen who have offered them the opportunity.

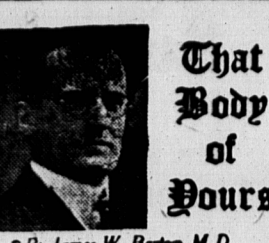
Something like half a million dollars is reported as being expended in highway road work as a note-catching expedient. It is quite apparent that the power, patronage and money of two allied Governments, with the highly alluring promise of millions to be expended in the near future are operating in New Brunswick today in a supreme effort to save the Veniot Administration.

The Armstrong Government was in every way doomed to defeat. It was weak in its personnel, it was loaded down with recent scandals, and was confronted by an Opposition, ably led and which had been so long out of power that it had no political sins to answer for.

The tremendous decrease in crime in Great Britain during the past fifty years is in strange contrast to the increase on this side of the Atlantic. In Great Britain the murderer rarely escapes. When caught, and he is almost invariably caught, he is tried and, if found guilty, he is sentenced to death and the sentence is never changed on the plea of insanity or any other subterfuge.

Premier Veniot as the first Acadian leader to win that high position in his Province has a devoted following of compatriots in eight counties in New Brunswick, in at least three of which the Acadian population is in a majority, while it constitutes a formidable number in five other counties.

It would be idle to predict the result of the vote so soon to be made known. If the Veniot Government is sustained today by a modest majority, or if the Opposition wins by a larger one, we shall not be greatly surprised, but in the latter case we shall regard the

The Record of Protection In Canada

In our previous article we briefly traced the proud record of Protection as a fiscal policy in the United States. We think no person can point to any country that can show such a satisfactory experience.

It is well known that Protection had gained a very firm foothold in Canada during the period it was in operation 1879-1896. Every fair-minded man will concede without a moment's hesitation that this was too short a period for a fair trial of any system, more especially in this new country.

Our research men have discovered that during inaction, a large mass of blood is diverted from the muscles to the abdominal cavity and elsewhere in the body, where it simply lies in an idle condition.

At this critical time in our history it is a matter of supreme importance to have the fact pointed out. Manufacturing industry in Canada is on the verge of collapse and the terrors of unemployment are ready to precipitate rebellion.

It did nothing to the mines and minerals in the earth and just as little to operate these mines. We can only thank the Lord for depositing the mines and minerals in Canada. What we expect the Government to boast about is what they have done for their own part. How many new industries have they brought into existence through the agency of the tariff? How many business houses have been added to those in existence four years ago? This is the acid test. Where do the men who are thrown out of employment in Canada turn to with hope of making a living? We submit that these are questions which should be asked and answered before the electors again mark their ballots.

It should be borne in mind, too, that there is another class of voters who are just as deeply interested in Canada's welfare as the men. We refer to the women of Canada. The greater portion of them we presume are married and have sons and daughters who have not reached voting age. It is the duty of all married electors to take a special interest in those young women and men as well as in all the juniors of the family until all can vote for themselves.

Everybody knows that when the writs are issued, candidates will be punctuated on hand. There will be no trouble in locating them. They will be well armed with promises—promises which are likely as not will never be kept. It is an easy matter to deal with those individuals. Every voter should exercise the right of asking the candidates whether they are in favor of protecting Canada or not. The question should be: "Are you in favor of a Protective policy or not?" If they all pledge themselves on the public platform to vote "Yes" in the House, why, the battle is won. Protection is
