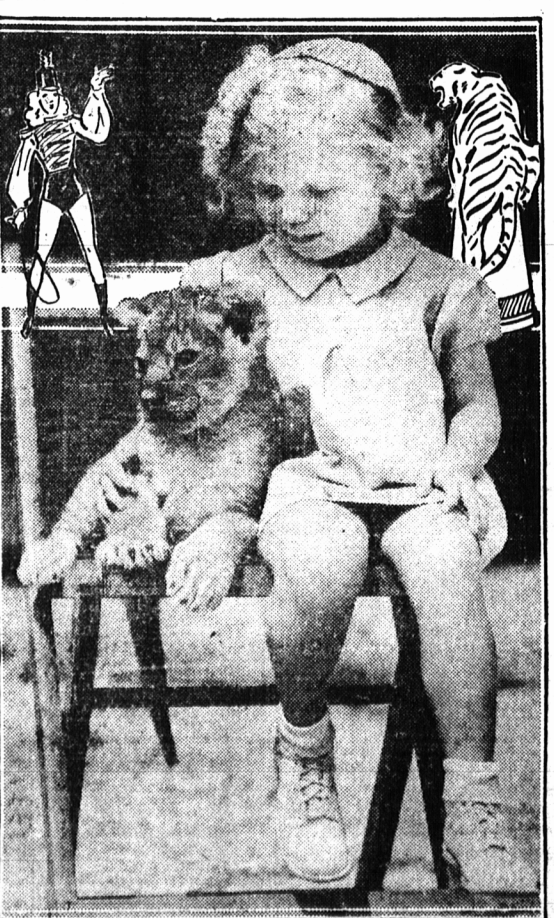

**WORKED HARD FOR HOSPITAL**

WINNIPEG, June 2—A white section of The Free Press is devoted to hospitals in the city and their beginnings. Someone writes of the Children's Hospital and of how Mrs. J. H. Bond, a trained nurse from the Old Country, founded it.

Working incessantly against adverse criticism, against those who doubted the feasibility of establishing a hospital exclusively for children, Mrs. Bond finally obtained support of a small group of women who determined to set up a hospital for children in a locality where the birth rate was highest. All funds had to be raised by the personal efforts of these few women.

With a modest diffidence Mrs. Bond tells how she, "with courage, pride of ignorance" took over a tea room on Portage Avenue. It was a hot summer and the home-made ice cream was a drawing card for the few people who remained in town. "This first little business venture in the interests of the pro-

posed children's hospital proved wide advertisement for that endeavor," she relates.

In looking for a location for her hospital, after weary search, Mrs. Bond finally was told about a house on Beacom's Street, at the end of Point Douglas.

Trudging through fields of unbroken snow, Mrs. Bond reached the empty house only to find it securely locked. Nothing daunted she climbed over the verandah rail and through a hole in the netting. Investigation disclosed that this house at one time the home of Lieutenant Governor Schultz, was large but dilapidated and very dirty.

"It looked as if it might be the home of regiments of night prowlers, but it was big, had three eyes, was on a sweep of the river and had ample grounds and there were trees that would be lovely in the spring. It was a treasure trove of cheerful white-haired woman as she nestled back against her pillows.
