It makes use of the child's desire to find out and explore the world around him; of his desire to construct; of his activity in doing concrete things. It aims to help him work out the meaning of all the experiences he meets into one great unity of Christian life and purpose; doing it in the consciousness that this means working with God in the development of His Kingdom.

And so the program takes the child on a series of exploring trips, first in his own home and with the express purpose of leading him to find out how God intended him to live in these relationships and having found out to actually walk day by day in the path he has discovered. Rotarians Hear Report On Big Convention

At Rotary Club this week an interesting report of the 14th annual Rotary International Convention held recently at St. Louis was read by Secretary W. M. Rowe which he attended as official delegate for the local club. The convention was in many respects the greatest Rotary gathering ever held. There were twenty-two countries represented, including England, Ireland, Scotland, Mexico, Cuba, Holland, France, Argentina, Hawaii, Australia, Canal Zone, China, New Zealand, Panama, Peru, Philippine Islands, Porto Rico, Spain, Uruguay, etc. The delegation from New Zealand, which comprised five men and four ladies, were over five weeks traveling to reach St. Louis, at an expense of several thousand dollars each.

There was a large delegation from Canada, all the clubs in the local 23rd district being represented. District Governor Walter Grant and his successor in office, Dr. H. L. Spangler, of St. John, were present. The Rotarians at St. Louis excelled themselves as entertainers, reports Rotarian Rowe. There were golf tournaments with trophies, tennis, automobile riding, boat trips on the Mississippi, grand opera, an evening at Forest Park Highlands, re-union dinners, President's ball and sight-seeing trips. Over 1,000 automobiles had been placed at the disposal of the St. Louis Rotary Club for the convenience of the visiting members. Banners, flags and bunting floated in the breeze from one end of the city to the other, and the sight of the large maple leaf badge worn by the Canadians brought many a hearty handshake either from a former Canadian or friend of Canada from far distant lands, or from just across the border.

The Convention sessions were held in an immense building known as the Coliseum, which had both the interior and exterior decorated with the flags of every nation embraced by Rotary, in addition to other beautiful decorations. The magnificent symbolic pageant, the address of welcome by Pres. Spangler of the St. Louis Club was recalled to by Rotarian McCullough, Past Pres. Rotary International, of Fort William. The President of Rotary International, Raymond M. Havens, of Kansas, Mo., presided at the convention and delivered the annual address.

Some wonderful addresses were delivered during the convention, among the outstanding speakers being president Walter W.
