### USE WOODEN SPOON

When mixing or stirring foods in porcelain enameled utensils, it is best to use a wooden spoon. Sharp metal instruments may mar the beauty or the glistening enamel finish.

### LINEN BLINDS

Linen blinds should be washed if they are beginning to look grubby, for if left, linen becomes extremely hard to clean and nothing looks worse than the patchy effect to be seen when it is dry. If you have deep sink, place the blind (after removing the roller and cross bar) over the edge of it and scrub it with a medium stiff brush. Use soapy lather, rolling it up as you work so that it drips back into the sink. Then fill the sink with lukewarm water and rinse the blind several times. See that there are no wrinkles in it when on the line. Iron with a hot iron while still very slightly damp.

## Dorothy Dix Says—

### MOST MOTHERS IGNORE GIRL'S CHIEF CAREER — HOME-MAKING

### Daughters Should Be Able To Support Selves But Also Need To Know How To Sew, Cook

DEAR MISS DIX—I wonder if a lot of us modern mothers, who have tried so hard to give our daughters what we call every "advantage," are not finding out that we missed teaching them many of the homely things they need more than they do the higher education? I, for instance, sent my daughter through college, and saw that she had dancing lessons and music lessons and lessons in appreciation of this and that, and that she was taught a profession; but now that she is about to be married I suddenly realize that she does not know how to sew, or cook, or market, or run a budget, and I am wondering if I have not failed in preparing her for life, after all!

### ERRED IN TRAINING GIRL

ANSWER—I think that you have, and that the mistake that you have made is one that most of the mothers of today are making. They seem to ignore entirely the fact that wifehood and motherhood are women's predestined careers now, just as they have been from time immemorial, and that while it is true for a few years after a girl may work at some trade or profession, she must eventually prepare herself for her marriage. Yet mothers spend their time and money having their daughters taught some occupation that they only follow for a year or two, but make no effort to prepare them for the work they will have to do the balance of their lives.

In the past every girl was Mother's little helper from the time she was big enough to stand on a box and help wipe the dishes. She was taught how to sew and to cook, how to sweep and dust, and all the details that go to the making and keeping of a comfortable home. But nowadays from the time girls are out of kindergarten they are so busy with their school and their parties that they have no time for any domestic duties, and they grow up practically ignorant of what the inside of a kitchen looks like.

Besides, Mother is trying to save her girls from all the drudgery of their home life, and their dubs and their parties that they have their finger nails polished red while her hands are soggy from dishwater and calloused from scrubbing.

Also, she holds the curious theory that while a girl has to study typing and stenography if she wants to be a secretary, or get a hospital training if she wants to be a nurse, or take a course in selling if she wants to be a saleswoman, a knowledge of cooking will come to her by inspiration as soon as the marriage ceremony is said over her.

Hence the average girl, who also thinks that running a house must be a job that any moron can pull off since Mother does it so well, goes into marriage without the slightest preparation for the role she is undertaking, and by the time she has learned to make bread that is edible and coffee that doesn't taste like poison she has ruined many a dollar's worth of good food that she has prepared and eaten.

Also she is lucky if she hasn't lost her husband, for the first disillusion that many a young husband gets is when he finds out that while she wants to be a saleswoman, a knowledge of cooking will come to her by inspiration as soon as the marriage ceremony is said over her.

It is all right to give girls the best possible education. It is being never lucky enough to them some way of supporting themselves if they are common sense to teach them how to cook and sew, and run a house, for these are things that every woman is going to need to know at some time during her life, no matter whether she is rich or poor, married or single.

After all of these years of happily married life my wife has decided that she does not know whether she loves me or not. ### THE COOK'S CORNER

**BAKED HADDOCK**  
One whole haddock, about 3 or 3 1/2 pounds, 3-4 cup boiling water, 2 large onions, chopped fine; few grains salt, 3-4 teaspoon salt, 6 cups bread crumbs, 1 day old; 2 tablespoons minced parsley.

Let haddock stand in salted cold water to cover for 3 minutes, then remove from water wipe dry, and cut through skin in 4 places so that it will not crack, during baking. Place haddock in a saucpan and onion in a saucpan and simmer gently 5 minutes, then add the crumbs, parsley and salt, and mix well. Stuff the fish with this dressing, and skewer the opening. Brush fish with melted fat, and bake uncovered, at a temperature of 475 degrees F. about 5 minutes. Turn fish tender, reducing the temperature to 450 degrees F. the last 15 minutes. Serve with lemon.

Price Control Questions And Answers

Questions and Answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board Readers. Persons who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board.

Q. My friend has purchased a pair of trousers which are too long for him. Is it permissible to have them finished with cuffs rather than to waste the cloth?

A. No. The trousers must be finished without cuffs. The extra cloth will not be wasted but will be retained by the tailor to be picked up for salvage.

Q. I have lost my ration book: can you tell me how I can get another one?

A. You must go to your Local Ration Board and get a statutory declaration form which must be filled out and sworn to. This application will then be considered by the proper authorities.

Q. Canned peas are not rationed. Each week I have been getting two cans and putting them away for next winter's use. Is this all right?

A. The Wartime Prices and Trade Board has stated that a householder may keep on hand only the normal supply for two weeks. This applies to city dwellers. In the rural districts, the housewife may stock a month's normal supply.

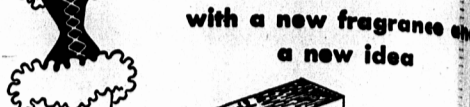

SHORTER HOURS  
Shorter hours for women in industry are recommended in a doctor's report to the British Association for Labour Legislation. Dr. H. M. Vernon, an expert in industrial health research, recommends that "in the interest of production as well as health, it would probably be best to work women only 48 hours a week with a temporary 54-hour week in times of special need."

Despite being assigned to light tasks, women tire more quickly than men, he said, and conditions of shopping and transport combined with long factory hours are taking their toll of health, so that production is adversely affected.
