The lecture by Father Murphy in St. Dunstan's Cathedral basement to-night will be preceded by a short musical program. The lecture is very interesting and the proceeds are for St. Vincent de Paul Sewing Circle which means that it is to procure clothing for the poor boys of the city.

Today, February 2 is Candlemas Day, and commonly accepted as the middle day of winter. Hence the old proverb that 'Candlemas Day takes half the corn and half the hay.' The day has also been popularly supposed to afford a forecast of the weather for the remaining portion of the winter. This has given rise to another rhymed proverb, "If Candlemas Day be fine and clear, we'll have two winters in one year." Another popular tradition is that on the 2nd day of February the bears leave their dens at noon and come out into a clear space, when, if they can see their shadows they return to their dens assured that there is much cold weather to come, but if the day is dark and the sun not shining they remain abroad in confidence that the remainder of the winter will be mild. This does not apply to the Stock Exchange bears.

HON. CLARENCE S. DARROW, counsel for the United Mine Workers before the anthracite coal Commission has published his reasons why he thinks trades unions should not become incorporated. He argues that the capitalists having tried to destroy the unions and failed now hope to effect their purpose by a law requiring them to incorporate. Mr. Darrow argues that incorporation would mean destruction. Among other things he says, "the high-priced railroad and other corporation lawyers would be ever ready to pounce upon the labor corporations at every opportunity that was offered. There is not a single labor organization that could keep out of the hands of a court for one year of its existence if it ever consented to become incorporated. All sorts of suits would be brought. Suits for real grievances and for imaginary grievances. Every court would be kept open for their undoing. There would not be one organization of labor which the employers wished to destroy that could keep out of the hands of a receiver for a year." Of course there are two sides to this as to many other questions.
