THE Dominion surveying steamer Gulnare, Captain Thomas G. Taylor, commander, is now ready for sea and will leave this port sometime this week. This year she has been painted white and presents a very neat and yacht like appearance. The color suits her splendidly. The crew are nearly all shipped. She will be employed on the tidal survey service on the straits of Belle Isle. Everything on board of the ship is spick and span, and ready for the work that has to be done. Dr. Bell Dawson, the head of the survey and his staff are expected to arrive at any day. The work done by this survey is of great benefit as the books are now being used by coasting boats, fishermen and all those who have need of the information gathered by the surveying staff. The Gulnare will have the same staff of officers as last year, namely: Captain, T. G. Taylor; 1st Mate, John Smith; 2nd Mate, James Hughes, 1st engineer, W. A. Robertson. 2nd Engineer, Peter McConnell. On leaving here the Gulnare will go to Picou to bunker, and thence will go to Belle Isle, and will be absent all summer. An ingenious device with which the Gulnare is provided is the anchoring apparatus. This enables the work of hoisting the anchor to be done by steam, and when the ship is swinging the buffer allows a give and take which relieves the vessel and crew of a lot of worry and work. She carries cable fitted to allow her to anchor up to 125 fathoms.
