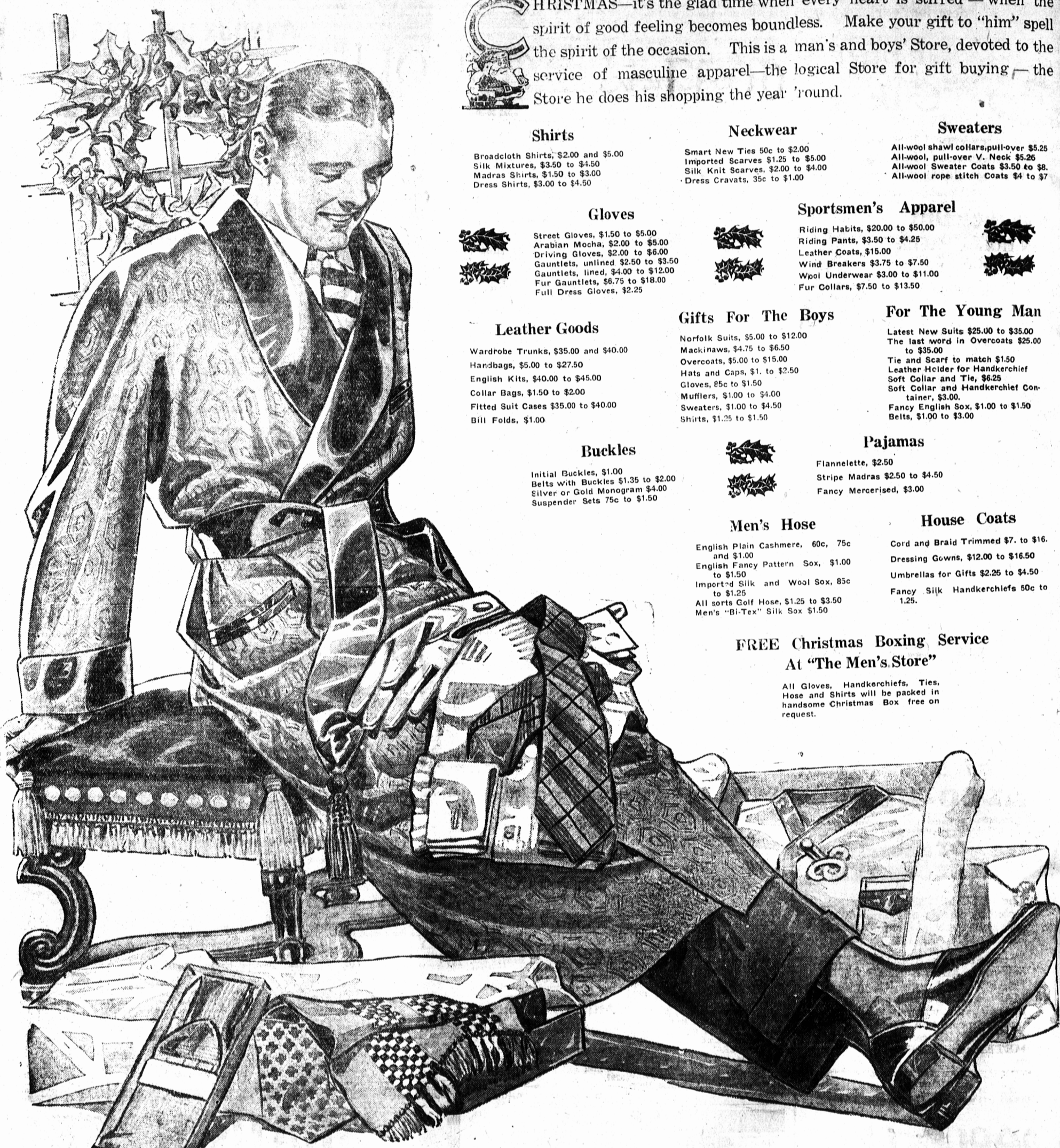

College Women Adverse To Marriage

A great many women have too much education and as a result find it difficult to marry. In the opinion of R. Le Clerc Phillips, an English feminist who is now living in New York City. In the first place, she points out, women educators do not always know life and men very well, and lay so much stress on the desirability of feminine reserve, that college graduates do not as a rule meet their admirers half way. Discussing "The Problem of the Educated Woman" in the December Harper's Magazine, Miss Phillips suggests that every woman's college employ as a counterbalance, a thoroughgoing woman of the world who has been successful in love and whose triumphs constitute a refutation of the college president's rigid-reserve theory of training.

The presence of a woman of resentment toward the type of woman who can be happy without art of human contacts, among a group of more or less desiccated women instructors might at least have an indirect influence on the students by humanizing, though ever so slightly, their regular teachers. Other factors in the case, Miss Phillips points out, are: the prevalent belief that over-much cultivation of the mind tends to cripple the emotions; the average man's

mentally involves. That they may for the character of a certain woman to a certain number is scarcely man has not killed their infantile keenly alive to the fact that wide discrepancy in the intellectual tastes of their suitors themselves was hardly conducive to a reasonably successful marriage.
