JOHN SUTHERLAND and William Turner, engineers of the S. S. Northumberland, left this morning for England to return on the new steamship Empress.

THE S. S. City of London returned from Capaud yesterday afternoon with six passengers and the following cargo: 100 cases eggs, 10 head of beef cattle and 5 sheep for local butchers; also 25 bags produce and a ton of sundry other consignments.

ROBERT J. AND MRS. CAMPBELL will be passengers by the Halifax, when she sails for Boston. They will be absent for about a month, which will be spent in visiting different points of interest in the U. S. They will be accompanied to Boston by Mrs. McNeill.

OWING to the dense fog and to the range lights not being visible the S.S. City of London anchored outside of Victoria harbor until 10.30 on Saturday night. She had the heaviest load of freight on record in the history of the route, and the warehouse held only one-half of it.

THE steamer Halifax, from Boston, is not expected to arrive until this evening. On her return to Halifax after this trip she will transfer freight and passengers to the Beverly, and that steamer will then take up the service between Boston and this port for a few weeks until the Halifax has been refitted.

At the regular monthly meeting of the City School Board last evening, the teachers' reports showed the enrollment for the past month to have been 1211; average attendance 1023; percentage 80; number of cases of tardiness 188; number of truants 4; visits by teachers 231; notices 30; corporate punishment 6; requests to leave before closing 50; fell below average 50. Three teachers reported no cases of tardiness during the month. The exceptionally good percentage of 88 was made in one department. Principal Campbell reported that Lieut. Governor MacKinnon had offered a plot of land in Government House Grounds for a school garden for Kent Street school; and the same offer applied to Prince Street school. After discussion Principal Seaman and Campbell were authorized to proceed in the matter of the gardens the committee on property and the Supervisor to be consulted regarding details. With reference to a request by the Daughters of the Empire to carry out a patriotic programme in the schools, as directed by the Imperial Order of the Daughters of the Empire, the principals were allowed to use their own discretion. Principal Landrigan submitted to the Board an application for authority to form a Cadet Association in connection with Queen Square School. The Board granted its approval of the same. It was agreed that Arbor Day be held on the 22d inst. Dr. Anderson being present, referred to the excellent condition of the City schools. The matter of proper ventilation and cleanliness of basement, cloak and reception rooms was discussed at length. Dr. Anderson stated that the Government would aid those schools that undertook garden work, by contributing a sum equal to half the amount expended by the school, but in no case to exceed ten dollars. A vote of thanks was tendered the Dr. for his suggestions.

Resolutions were passed providing for the continuance of the work of the commission in the greatest activity and especially for the completion of the report on the preference showing the advantages to Great Britain and the lines on which, from the side of Great Britain, the greatest advance can be made.
