**THE BURDEN OF THE BARNACLES.**

The Toronto Globe which in the days of the Ross Government in Ontario referred very seriously to the barnacles on the ship of state returned to the subject the other day. At the outset it tells how during their sojourn in tropical waters the Russian ships from the Baltic became so loaded with barnacles as to decrease their speed by one fourth. It is added that a British ship a few years ago had eighty tons of barnacles removed from its bottom and in eight months in warm latitudes thirty cart loads of barnacles attached themselves to an American ship of only eight hundred tons. All of which would go to show that barnacles pay no heed to nationality or flag, but are equally troublesome to British, American or Russian ships.

"In these latitudes," proceeds The Globe "the ship of state is exposed to the handicap that helped to the undoing of Rojestvensky's fleet. Premier Whitney has already discovered the difference between the cold waters of opposition and the tropical waters of office." "The barnacles are the burden and the curse of every Government ship. No doubt 'the tropical waters of office,' to use The Globe's figure of speech, are fruitful of barnacles, but beyond this central fact

The Globe's argument is at fault. Oliver Mowat of happy memory succeeded in navigating the tropical waters of office for more than a quarter of a century without permitting his ship to become thus encumbered to any considerable extent. Certainly the Ontario hull became much more encumbered during the last few years that Premier Ross was in command than during the long term of Premier Mowat, and yet the ship of state was equally in the tropical waters of office all the time.

Again, if sailing in the tropical waters of office inevitably involves the ship in a heavy encumbrance of barnacles, what must be the condition of the federal Government after nine years, and of the Government of Nova Scotia after twenty-three years of continuous office holding? Probably even The Globe will admit that the curse of barnacles is not so inevitable as its argument would go to show. In point of fact very much depends upon the energy, industry and determination of the captain and crew in keeping the ship in good sailing order. Such we believe to be the case. Perhaps a dwelling house is a truer symbol of a Government, than is a ship. No house keeper is ever excused for keeping a dirty house and no Government ought to plead necessity as an excuse for "barnacles." Incompetence or something worse is in evidence when the governing body fails to give the country clean, honest and efficient administration.

The Russ, a leading paper in St Petersburg, talks sound sense in giving warning to the Russian Government against harboring designs of revenge against Great Britain for her sympathy with Japan. The Russ points out that any armed attack upon India would be enormously costly at best, and that under the renewed and strengthened alliance between Britain and Japan it would inevitably bring the latter again into the fight. Just now there exists in Russia a very wholesome respect for the fighting qualities of the Japanese.

In what we said yesterday as to the desirability of displaying school work at the coming Exhibition it was not intended to convey any impression that the management are unwilling to encourage the schools. We recall that in former years prizes were given at the Exhibition for the best kept school grounds in each county as certified by the several Inspectors. These prizes seemed not to have the desired effect of stimulating teachers and pupils to make school grounds attractive and were for this and other reasons discontinued. In regard to manual training and the consolidated schools we learn that those in charge of these branches of educational work were some months ago communicated with in regard to making any display they might desire and any space required was offered. There are obvious difficulties in the way of the Exhibition management giving prizes unless in cases where there is competition.

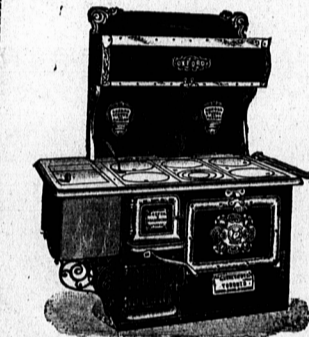

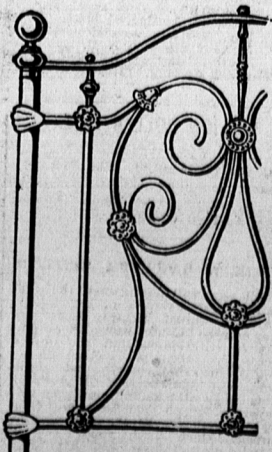
