NEW YORK, March 6—(AP)—The stock market enjoyed a fast, brief rally today following the Supreme Court decision against John L. Lewis and his mining union but most extreme advances of 1 to 2 points were reduced at the close with dealings slowing appreciably. The rally which had not been expected until at least next Monday caught Wall Street by surprise and bidders quickly swarmed over virtually all departments. Earlier considerable irregularity had prevailed. The sprint was short-lived and the list soon reverted to apathy.
