**MONTREAL, Que., May 15**—More than 2000 dependents, 640 service men and 278 civilians will arrive in Halifax on three liners scheduled to dock on Monday and Tuesday according to information received here today by the Canadian National Railways. Nine trains will be needed to handle the total of 2868 passengers on Monday the Aquitania is due with 957 dependents, 300 Canadian soldiers, seven Canadian Red Cross nurses, 304 British service personnel and 278 civilians. The Lady Rodney, former C. N. S. S. peace time pleasure cruiser to West Indies is scheduled to arrive on Tuesday with 226 overseas wives of Canadian servicemen. The same day the Letitia will put into the Atlantic port carrying 863 women and children.

**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**WINNIPEG, May 15 (CP)**—The deferred months in coarse grain futures developed considerably today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange as a result of firm buying by local houses and American speculators.

**CHICAGO, May 15 (AP)**—A few transactions were made in August and March wheat deliveries today at \$1.93 1-2, up five cents but five cents under the ceilings in these new contracts. Both old and new oats contracts ruled firm on gains of around 1-2 cent while May's dropped live cents for the eighth consecutive day.

**MONTREAL, May 15 (CP)**—Losses were in the majority in trading today on the stock exchange and curb market with all pivot and selected stocks in the indices except golds which were marked up.

Prominent in transactions and interest was Montreal Power, which dropped 3-4 following announcement of the details of the offer to purchase hydro for the expropriated utility.

**NEW YORK, May 15 (AP)**—Stock market prices continued to retreat today for the third consecutive session, although a few utilities and selected industrials made some progress.

Losses ranged from fractions to 3-4 points. Publisher Industrials fell 8 3-4 to \$55.25. American Telephone was off 3-8 at \$194.12.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite fell 4 of a point to 78.9.

**TORONTO, May 15 (CP)**—Stocks continued on the Toronto exchange today to move on a downward trend. All index groups ended the session with losses but the declines were not wide. The golds led with a loss of 37 and the other groups were down 27 to 40.

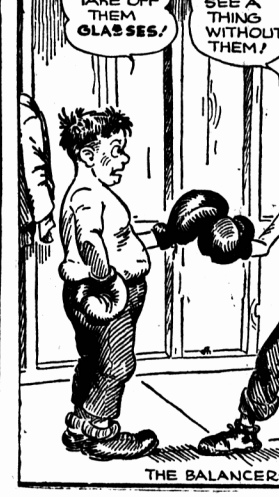

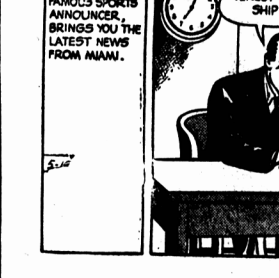

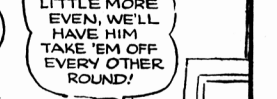
**TOMATO HOME STORAGE**

In the storage of tomatoes in the home, ripe ones keep well in the refrigerator but green tomatoes will not ripen well there. They should be laid out without touching each other in a dark cool place and transferred to the refrigerator or another cold place when they turn red. Another method is to pull up the vines with the tomatoes on them and hang them in a basement or warm garage to allow the fruit to ripen. Tomatoes may be wrapped in paper and stored in a box. A tomato ripened on the vines has better flavour than one which has been picked green.
