HIGHWAY ROBBERY WALKS HOME WITH IN WESTMOUNT SHOT IN STOMACH

MONTREAL, July 28.—Westmount was the scene of a startling highway robbery on Saturday night, Richard Hensley, the St. James street jeweler, being the victim.

Mr. Hensley, as the result of the treatment he received, will be confined to the house for about six weeks, for besides blows and kicks, he sustained a fracture of the small bone of one leg. This, he presumes, was caused by his fall to the sidewalk.

When held up he was quite near his home. He was walking along Sherbrooke street, about 11.30, and had just reached the corner of Clarke avenue, when three men caught up with him.

The first had just passed, when he wheeled around and dealt Mr. Hensley a stinging blow on the head. This was followed up by others, and in an instant he was struggling on the sidewalk.

The three thugs then started in to relieve him of his valuables. They ripped open his pants pocket, and secured what money he had, which amounted to four dollars. That was all they got, for they heard a wagon coming, and made good their escape up Clarke avenue leaving their victim on the ground.

Immediately afterwards Chief Moffitt and two of his men started for the top of the mountain in a buggy, to search for the highwaymen, but the robbers had a sufficient start to get away.

He is about 24 years old.

EARL ROBERTS TO VISIT ROCKIES

QUEBEC, July 29.—Earl Roberts has completely changed the itinerary of his western trip, yielding to the urgent solicitations of Sir Thomas Shaughnessy. He will leave Quebec on Thursday, the 30th instant, and proceed direct to Montreal, where he will spend two days proceeding thence to Ottawa and from Ottawa to Toronto in which city he will spend August 5, 6 and 7.

From Toronto the Earl will cross Lake Ontario to Niagara Falls, returning thence to Toronto to take the special train in which, as the guest of Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, he will cross the prairies to Calgary, proceeding from Calgary to Banff. Earl Roberts will obtain a fine view of the Rocky Mountains' scenery. His train will then be run back to Kingston, where he will embark for a trip through the Thousand Islands reaching Quebec in time to catch the Empress on August 21.

TROOPS FORCED FIRE ON NATIVES

BOMBAY, July 28.—There was a renewal of the outbreaks here recently. The mob spread over from the mill district and held up the Poona mail train. They finally had to be driven off by volleys from the military.

Europeans are jeered and stoned whenever they appear on the streets, and when the police and troops make rescues they are frequently obliged to use their revolvers. There have been heavy casualties as a result of the firing. All the available military including the volunteer corps and the light horse, have been called out.

In the course of the evening a defiant and fanatical mob bombarded the office of a Police Magistrate with heavy paving stones. The volunteer rifles were called to the rescue and fired on the natives. Five men are known to have been killed, and 41 wounded have been taken to the hospitals.

Twenty thousand mill hands went out on strike to demonstrate their sympathies for Tilak, the Nationalist leader, who was sentenced a few days ago to transportation for six years on the charge of sedition. Tilak was the editor of a newspaper which published virulent attacks against British rule.
