GREAT BRITAIN AWAITS ACTION OF U. STATES

Viscount Grey Makes a Statement in House of Lords Relative to Patrol of British Warships Off United States Coast also to Operations of U-53.

LONDON, October 17.—The British government will not make any official representation to the United States concerning the German submarine U-53 pending an announcement of its attitude by the American government, said Viscount Grey, secretary of state for foreign affairs in the house of lords today.

CH'TOWN BOARD OF TRADE VISITS THE CARLETON POINT TERMINALS

Consults Engineers and Hears Opinions of Railway Men as to Facilities Required for Transference of Freight. Strong Resolution Adopted.

A special committee of the Charlottetown Board of Trade, consisting of Messrs. G. E. Full, (Chairman), Jas. Paton, M. L. A., N. Rattenbury, E. T. Higgs, W. H. Aitken, and H. V. Buntain, accompanied by a large majority of the members of the Board, yesterday paid an official visit to the Car Ferry Terminal at Carleton Point, where they looked over the whole ground and thoroughly inspected the works, afterwards examining a number of the officials of the P. E. I. Railway with regard to freight transference facilities and kindred questions.

CRISIS IN GREECE NEARING A CLIMAX

Last Vestige of Power Being Stripped from King Constantine. Venizelos Recognized by Entente Powers. Royalists Stirring Up Feeling Against Invaders.

LONDON Oct. 18.—The Greek tragedy now begins to move toward its inevitable end. After months of temporizing the Allies have cast the die. They have virtually taken over control of the city. Other troops have occupied important places in Piræus, and dominate railroad traffic from the port.
