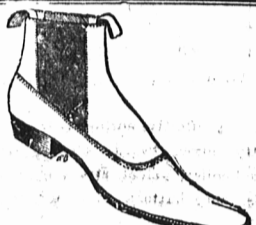

The smoked herring establishment at Georgetown has been sold by G. P. Newton of Grand Manan to a local company consisting of Temple W. McDonald, J. W. McPherson, Georgetown, and George A. Poole, Lower Montague. Mr. Newton has conducted the business for about six years at Georgetown.

During the last week in March the sad intelligence was brought to the home of Mrs. Archibald Fisher, Bay Fortune, that her only daughter Clementina Helena had died at Salda, Colorado. She had gone west about a year and a half ago to recover her health and was gradually improving, but a change suddenly took place and in spite of all that could be done, the end came calmly and peacefully. Her sunny disposition and gentle manner secured her a great many friends, but her death is an especially severe shock to her widowed mother and four sorrowing brothers, to all of whom the most sincere sympathy is extended.

There occurred at Peake's Station on April 2nd, the death of James A. McDonald, a respected inhabitant of that place. Mr. McDonald was in the 74th year of his age and was enjoying his usual good health until about three weeks previous to his death when he was stricken with paralysis. He rallied however and the best of hopes were entertained by his relatives for his complete recovery and thus his death came as a great shock to them and the surrounding community. A large concourse of people despite the unfavorable condition of the roads, followed his remains to St. Teresa's where a solemn Mass of Requiem was offered up by the Rev. I. R. A. McDonald P. P. assisted by the Rev. A. P. McLellan, St. Andrews, and Rev. A. P. McIntyre, Morell, after which the remains were interred in the adjoining cemetery. He leaves to mourn a widow, two sons and four daughters, also one sister and four brothers (the Rev. James A. E. McDonald, P. P. East Point, being a brother.)

The cause of numerous diseases and disagreeable habits, here before ascribed as constitutional, have been traced directly to the teeth. Blindness, drooping, frothing, loss of flesh, weak eyes, driving on one rein and pulling are very often due to diseased and irregular teeth. Rough edges and sharp corners of the teeth lacerate the mouth, and produce nervousness and irritability; uneven and elongated molars and incisors prevent the proper mastication of the food, producing indigestion and general debility. Decayed molars cause necrosis of the bone, abscesses, nasal gleet, etc. These causes should be removed by extracting or trephining, sharp corners and rough edges should be smoothed down, and elongated and uneven molars and incisors cut off. The common float, or file heretofore deemed sufficient to accomplish this, will not suffice but special instruments devised for the purpose are necessary. 4-25th St.
