FIGHTING FIRE WITH ELECTRICITY.

CURIOUS WORK OF LIGHTNING

LONDON, Oct. 1.—Some curious freaks were played by the lightning during a recent great storm. In Alnwick an old man and woman were sitting at dinner when a flash of lightning struck their house. It came through the diningroom between them, then made for a gun in the corner of the room, which it smashed to atoms, and finally went to earth through the floor. Neither of the two occupants of the room was hurt.

In another case the lightning came down the chimney, bringing bricks and mortar on the top of a small boy who was playing in front of the fire. It then went across the room, killing a dog that was under the table, and out of the door. The boy was unhurt. In appealing for help for the sufferers from the storm the Rev. A. A. Hancock, rector of Little Staughton, St. Neots, writes: "Scarcely a window pane which met the force of the storm remains unbroken. The effect of the bombardment, for it was nothing less, is terrible. One end of the village presents almost the appearance of a battlefield. Crops are ruined, the wheat, barley, oats and beans, just ready to reap, were literally threshed as they stood, scarcely on ear retaining any grain."

TREPOFF'S DEATH DUE TO POISON

ST. PETERSBURG, Oct. 1.—It is said that it has been definitely established that Gen. Trepoft died from poisoning on Aug. 30. A man with a bandaged face and complaining of a toothache entered a drug store and asked for fifteen grammes of cocaine.

The clerk, surprised at the enormous quantity of the drug required, demanded a doctor's prescription. The man said he was a doctor named Sokoloff. He wrote a prescription, and after receiving the drug left the store, being joined outside by a woman student. The week before Gen. Trepoft died, revolutionists sent a cipher telegram to their followers announcing that he would be poisoned within a week.

A professor who examined the intestines of the dead general found traces of cocaine poisoning and the police found in the kitchen of the palace a book treating of cocaine. The alleged doctor, Sokoloff, was arrested, but his accomplices were not discovered.

Immediately after the government announced that the policy of repression would be followed and (amp tribunals established the revolutionists replied that they would substitute poison for bomb and pistol.

HARVARD MEN TO BE ARRESTED

BOSTON, Sept. 29.—Police Commissioner Stephen O'Meara issued a statement last night that the police would apply for warrants for the arrest to-day of two men, supported to be Harvard students who assaulted Reserve Officer Frabar who was on duty on Boston Common on Thursday night. One of the assailants, who was questioned by the police at the station just after the assault, said he was a son of President Roosevelt. He was allowed to go.

Yesterday the police commissioner investigated the case, but up to a late hour last night no arrests had been made. The police have a description of the assailants, but have not been able to identify them. Officer Frabar was tripped up on the Common while attempting to apprehend two young men who were teasing a man on a settee. In falling the officer sustained a fracture of the nose and was taken to a hospital.
