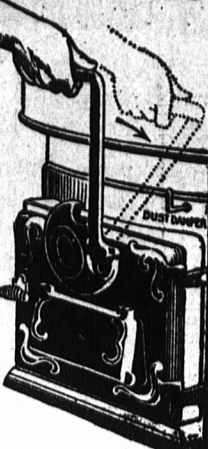

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

LESSON I.—JULY 7.
GOD FEEDS ISRAEL IN THE WILDERNESS.

Exodus 16, 1-15. Memorize verse 4.

GOLDEN TEXT.
I am the living bread which came down from heaven.—John 6:51.

EXPLANATIONS.

V. 1. Journey—By the divine signal, Elim (See 15:27)—Elim stood for safety, peace, fellowship, rest, protection; but they may not abide there. All—the large host as beginning to be organized, Wilderness—The northern part of this section. After—Some of their stations are omitted in this record (See Numbers, chap. 9:2).

V. 2, 3. Murmured—They were as children, easily fretted, and the spirit of fault-finding always spreads rapidly. Moses—Because leader, and that he might relieve them. Would to God—a distraction of the religious sense. Did—The voice of a narrow vision and judgment. Flesh pots—As if that were all of life! To kill—A crazy charge against their best friends.

V. 4, 5. The Lord—Graciously interposing to avert rebellion, and assure his servants. Rain—Plenty, and by miracle. Rite—a day's portion. Prove—to see if the trouble was the lack of food or lack of obedient spirit. Sixth—The day before the Sabbath. To avoid work on the Sabbath. Even the wilderness must know that there is a Sabbath (Exodus 21:8-11).

V. 6-8. Know—By the miracle of the quails (v. 13). Lord—Not Moses. Glory—Manna, or some other sign. We—Only God's agents (See Matt. 10:40). Said—Retracting what he had already stated. Against him—Moses would impress them with their disobedience to God.

V. 9-12. Come—Another illustration of God's long-suffering. Verifying what Aaron had promised. The people "looked" and God appeared. Spake—The people thus were aware of the authority of Moses. Heard—This voice was so that all could know it was God speaking. Even—Between 3 and 6 p. m. Flesh—The quails. Bread—The manna. Know—Because these tests are made. Your—And therefore pledged to supply all their need while in the wilderness.

V. 13-15. Came—Confirming the promise. Covered—In great abundance. Dew—As it first seemed to them. Hoar—That is, white. Manna—Literally, "what is it?" And their question becomes its name. Bread—Assuring them of its worth. This manna differed from the manna of the desert tree, in amount, in character and composition, in extent, in the double quantity on Friday, in that it spoiled when kept over—all proving that it was miraculously given. For forty years they continued to eat this manna, God providing it for 2,000,000 people.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY person numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 3 and 21, not reserved, shall be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, of any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter-section of 160 acres, more or less.

Colony must be made, personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated.

The homesteader is required to perform the following plans: (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) If the father or mother, if the father is deceased of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for settlement as to residence may be satisfied by that person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon a farm land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply. V. W. CORY, Deputy of the Interior.

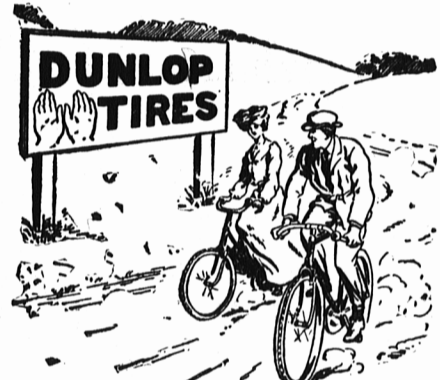
