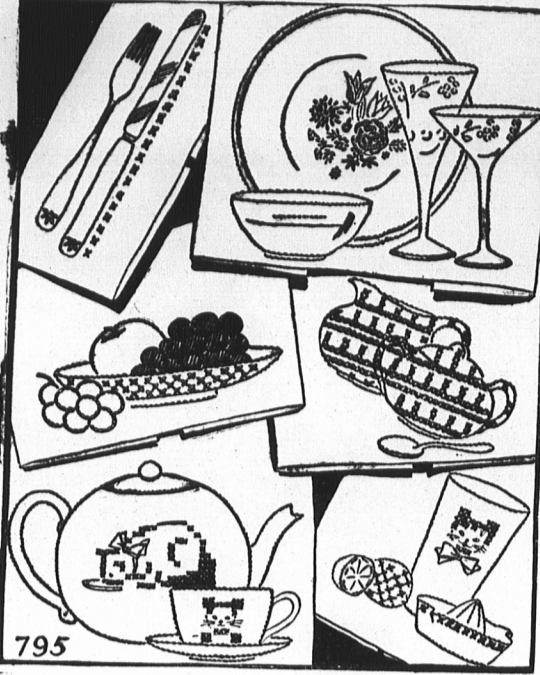

THE COOK'S CORNER

RHUBARB PINEAPPLE JAM

2 pounds rhubarb
2 pounds sugar
2 lemons, juice and grated rind
1 cup crushed pineapple
Method: Use rhubarb for this jam that has as much color as possible. Wash it and cut into 1-2-inch lengths. Combine with the sugar, the grated rind and juice of the lemons and the crushed pineapple that has been thoroughly drained. Bring slowly to a boil and stir until the sugar is dissolved, then boil fairly rapidly until the mixture is thickened somewhat. Stir the mixture quite often to prevent its sticking to the bottom of the pan. Pour at once into hot, sterilized jars and seal with melted paraffin. When this has hardened, another layer of paraffin may be added, and then the covers placed on the jars, or the jars may be covered with paper which is tied on tightly with string.
A combination of rhubarb and strawberries is used in the next

RECIPE. Then too, in place of using all sugar, part honey is used for sweetening.

STRAWBERRY RHUBARB JAM

4 cups rhubarb
4 cups strawberries
3 1-2 cups sugar
1-2 cups honey
Method: Wash the rhubarb and cut into 1-inch lengths. Add half the sugar to this and allow to stand for about 2 hours to extract the juice.
Wash and hull the strawberries. Measure them, and then crush them. Add the remaining sugar and the honey to these and then combine with the rhubarb mixture. Heat this slowly until the sugar and honey are dissolved, stirring constantly. Now bring to a vigorous boil and cook like this for about 15 minutes, or until the jam is thickened somewhat. Stir the mixture frequently to prevent its sticking to the bottom of the pan. Pour the mixture into hot sterile jars and seal with melted paraffin. When this coat of paraffin becomes hardened, add a second layer. Cover the jars and store in a cool, dry place.

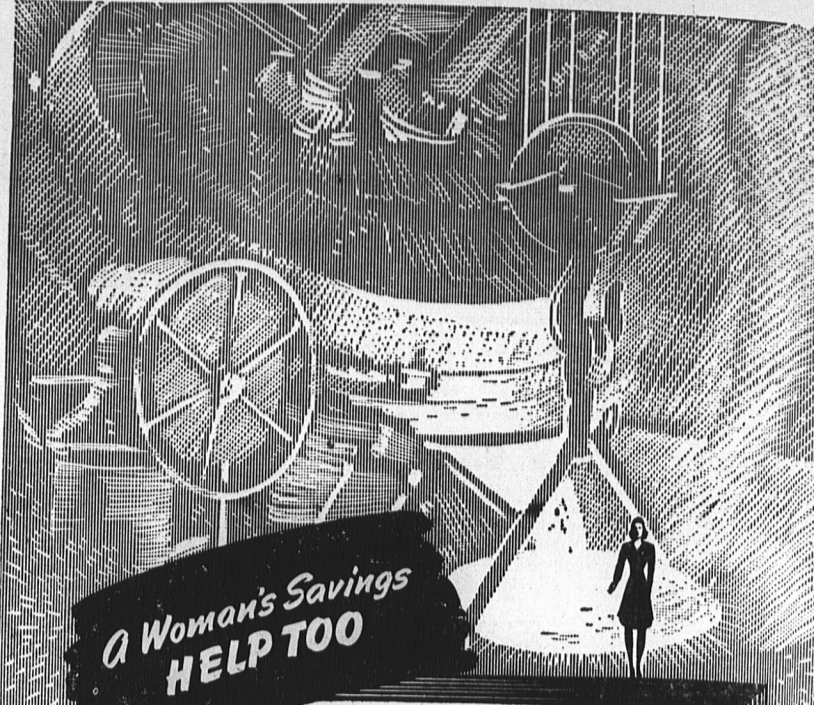
CONCRETE CAN BE COLORED

Overloading

Hang trousers from the bottom, their weight helping to pull them back into shape. It is worthwhile to brush dust and dirt from the cuffs before hanging. Replace buttons promptly. When one comes off, a strain is put on another, pulling the suit out of shape.

Avoid loading pockets with "junk." Too much weight or bulk pulls a suit or coat out of shape, strains the seams. Be careful of sparks from cigarettes, cigar and pipes. A damaged fabric can not be rewoven. Have soiled fabrics cleaned for longer life. Thorough airings will help prevent moth damage.

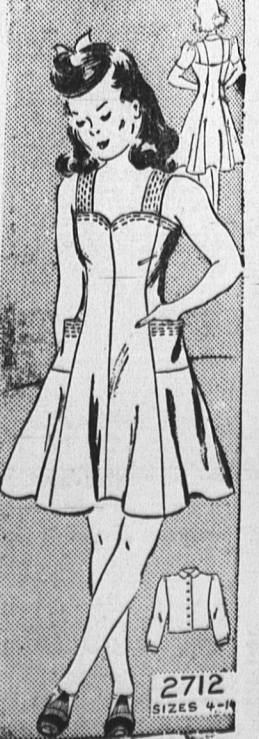
