THE OTTAWA CITIZEN of Sept. 23rd says: Yesterday pulpits talked of loyalty to rulers. The services of the Dominion Methodist church yesterday were of a patriotic character. Two Union Jacks enveloped the pulpit. At the conclusion of the sermon two verses of the National Anthem were sung. The last hymn was that for those in peril on the sea. It was sung as Dr. Ross, the pastor, was on the ocean, on his way home. He will preach in the church on the first Sunday in October. Rev. George Irving, a native of Vernon River, P. E. I., in the course of his sermon, referred to the good laws by which the subjects of the British empire were governed. He alluded to the loyalty of Canada and to the striking example of patriotism given by Lord Strathearn. "Today," continued the preacher, "the country needs far more than lip-service to the state. While we rejoice in the successes of our flag we cannot fail to recognize that there are weak points in the British Empire. One of these weak points is the Sabbath desecration. A common form of this evil is the custom of some to have picnics and excursions on Sunday. This is a menace to the country and the tendency towards these forms of Sunday amusement is altogether deplorable. Another weakness is caused by the fact that some men would like to take away the Divine personal God and Saviour. Intemperance constitutes another weakness and is a sad blot on our national life. We do not pose as an alarmist, but we do believe that there are certain weak points in our Empire and we, as loyal subjects of the King would do well to our part in eliminating those weaknesses. We pray," the speaker concluded, "that God may abundantly protect and bless those who are our honored guests while they are in our land, and we pray that they may return home in safety to convey to His Gracious Majesty King Edward our devotion and loyalty to him. May Canada ever be famed for its true loyalty to the British Empire and its sovereigns."

A NEW DEPARTURE IN MUSIC, FOR CHARLOTTETOWN.—We had the pleasure of visiting the Musical Studio of Mr. H. A. Tanton, of Great George St. yesterday, and we were indeed surprised, and pleased to know that such handsome, and well equipped rooms existed in our midst, for the training of the young, in that greatest of all arts, Music, both vocal and instrumental. About a year ago when Mr. Tanton returned to Charlottetown after an absence of nine years in New York, where he studied under some of the most eminent masters of the great metropolis. We gave an extended notice of his studio, and rooms that he opened in his own building on Great George Street, we shall not repeat the same description further than to say that the rooms were a decided novelty for Charlottetown; and far in advance of anything ever attempted here before. We find on revisiting Mr. Tanton's establishment that he has been steadily increasing his equipment, also adding to the comfort, and beauty of his rooms, and his latest acquisition, a very handsome Kamm Warren two-manual pedal bass organ, for teaching Pipe, and Church organ playing completes one of the best equipped Musical Studios to be found in the Lower Provinces. This organ which was personally selected by Mr. F. S. Jost, the proprietor of the firm of Miller Brothers, while on his recent trip to the Upper Provinces, was finished, and arranged according to plans and specifications laid down by Mr. Tanton, and both the Kamm Co., and Mr. Tanton are to be congratulated on the number of unique and valuable ideas it contains, having all the necessary mechanical combinations of a full sized Pipe Organ, thereby enabling pupils to become familiar with that king of all instruments. The organ is in a solid black walnut case, figured walnut panels, handsome designs, and fine finish, all the measurements of manuals, and pedals correspond exactly with that of a Pipe Organ and the volume, and quality of tone is surprisingly like that of a modern Church pipe organ. With this instrument installed in his rooms Mr. Tanton is now in a position to take pupils for instruction in pipe organ playing, and also to arrange for them to have the privilege of practicing on this instrument. The advantage of having this organ is at once obvious. Pedal practice is one of the most inconvenient features of an organist's experience; it is difficult to get the use of a Church organ at all times, particularly in winter, when our Churches are only heated on Sabbath, but with this magnificent instrument in Mr. Tanton's studio, and under his able guidance, the most intricate phases of organ playing can be studied, and rehearsed under his personal supervision. We congratulate Mr. Tanton on his latest acquisition, and bespeak for him a large patronage from all lovers of Church music.

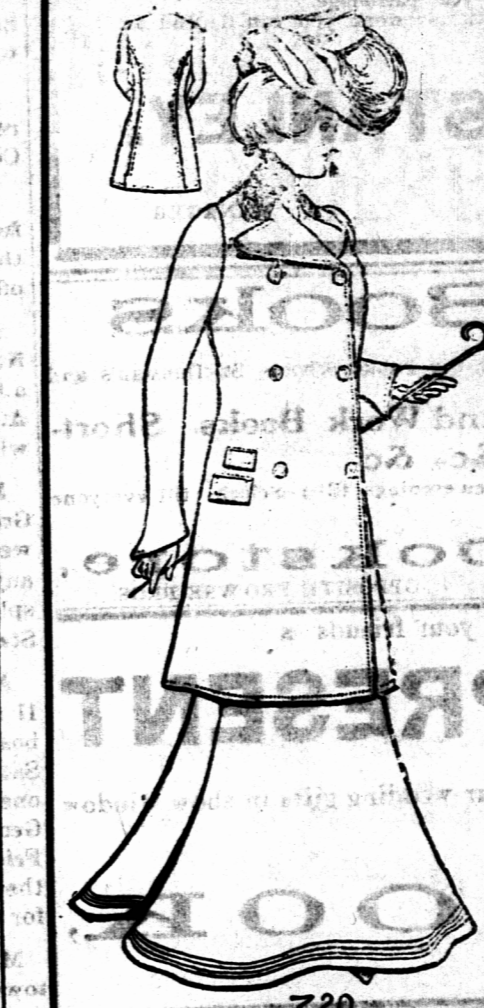
