A STRICTER PROHIBITORY LAW THAN OURS.

Kansas has been making its prohibitory liquor law more stringent than it was. As interpreted by the Attorney General of the State, clubs cannot sell to their members from liquor which is the joint property, nor are members allowed to keep liquors in private lockers at the club houses. Druggists were under the former law permitted to fill prescriptions for medical purposes, or to sell for mechanical or scientific purposes, on the affidavit of the purchaser that the liquor was for such purposes, and not for use as a beverage.

This privilege is now taken away, having been abused and druggists are now forbidden to sell even on a physician's prescription. A number of respectable druggists desired this change, knowing how the prescription trade in liquors was conducted. A druggist may not display liquors on his shelves, such being considered prima facie evidence of an unlawful purpose, and rendering him liable to arrest.

The purchase of the liquor for home use, when made in an outside State is beyond the power of any State to prohibit, but each town is

THE COW-TESTING ASSOCIATIONS SUCCESSFUL.

The records of the cow-testing associations throughout Canada show a large increase in the number of cows whose production is being recorded. They also show that many farmers have been enabled to increase the yield of milk and fat per cow. A circular issued by the Department at Ottawa tells that herds that used to produce only 187 lbs fat are now up to 220 lbs; milk production has gone up from 4,850 lbs to 6,380 lbs. In 1905 one herd averaged 5,374 lbs milk it.
