NEW STEWARD FOR OXFORD (Canadian Press) LONDON, Jan. 3.—Lord Sankey, the Lord Chancellor, has been elected high steward of Oxford University in succession to the late Earl of Birkenhead. The office is reminiscent of the time when the university was governed by a code apart from that of the common law. As officially defined it will be Lord Sankey's duty to hear and determine criminal cases of the gravest kind, such as treason and felony, at the mandate of the chancellor and according to the laws of the land and privileges of the university whenever the accused is a scholar or privileged person resident within the precincts of the university. For his services Lord Sankey will receive the sum of £25 a year.

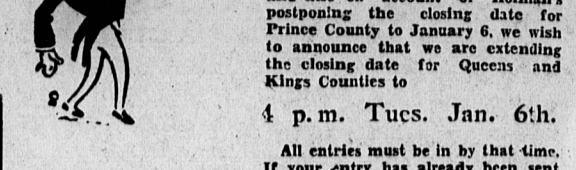
