Rangers Chalkup Second Straight Victory Over Abbies With 7-3 Win

Junior Rangers, displaying the same systematic attack that has marked all their games in other seasons, last night chalked up their second straight victory of this season when they sent the Abbies tumbling to a 7-3 defeat.

Stronger on the attack and defence once the Ranger attack started clicking there wasn't very much to it. Behind twice in the first period the winners staged a two-goal rally in the dying minutes of the first session and from there on were never headed.

Leading their successful attack was the sparkling line of Worth, Whitlock and McEachern, a trio that accounted for five of the Ranger goals with the "Buffer" scoring three of them, and having an assist to give him four scoring points during the game.

Continually forcing the attack the winners had a big edge in the final session. Time after time they bored in on top of the harassed Abbie goalie and it was only Langille's spectacular work behind the pipes that kept the Rangers from scoring more than two goals during the final twenty minutes. The Ranger score of the session was 2-1 at the 2:47 mark with "Tarky" Whitlock counting unassisted and at 8:53 Rangers wound up the scoring of the game when Worth shot his third goal of the game on a pass from Whitlock.

Hank Greenberg, Detroit Tiger's First Baseman, League Batting Champion

(By The Associated Press) CHICAGO, Dec. 15 —(AP)—A season of virtual inactivity failed to damage big Hank Greenberg's ability to slant hits with men on bases.

The Detroit Tiger first baseman who led the American baseball league in the art of batting runs over the plate in 1935, but was able to play in only 12 games in 1936 because of a wrist injury, came back bigger and better than ever last season, to recapture the title from Hal Trosky of Cleveland, the official averages disclosed today.

Greenberg's bat drove in 183 runs, only one short of the league record established by Lou Gehrig of New York Yankees in 1931, and 13 better than his own leading mark in 1935.

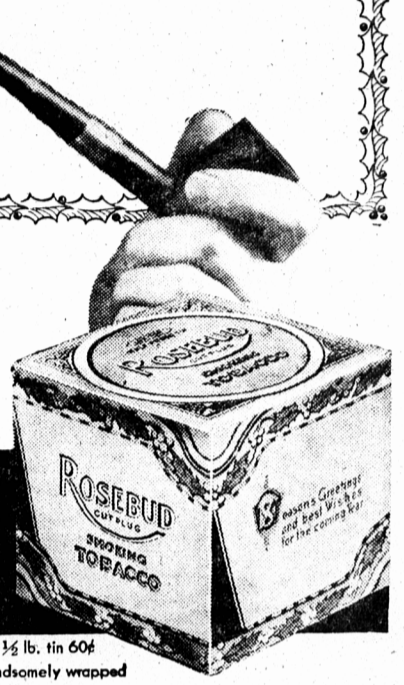
