### British Warships To Bring Soldiers

LONDON, April 16.—In the House of Commons Mr. Archibald Hurd asked "will the secretary for war arrange that Canadian troops now awaiting repatriation be sent home upon British warships in view of the scarcity of merchantmen?"

Mr. Wilson replied that the Admiralty had agreed to place a certain number of warships at the disposal of the authorities for the repatriation of troops. The difficult question of manning was being discussed between the Admiralty and the Minister of Shipping. Anyhow no difficulty was now being experienced in providing sufficient tonnage for the repatriation of Canadians in accordance with the programme of the Canadian military authorities.
