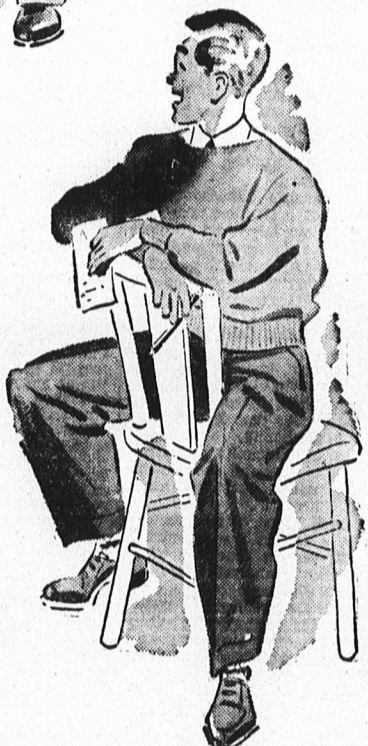

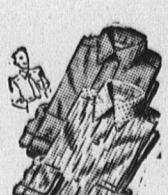

**MERMAID RED CROSS ACTIVITIES**

The Mermaid Red Cross Unit held its annual meeting on July 30th at the home of Mrs. Edgar White. A summary of the reports then presented by the officers of this Unit shows that 24 meetings have been held during the year. The main undertaking of this group was the knitting of various garments. One hundred and forty-two skeins of yarn were knit into 42 sweaters, 18 scarves, 33 pairs socks, 8 helmets, 11 aero caps, 41 pairs mitts, 3 ladies' helmets, 3 ladies' vests, 1pr. knickers, 6 prs. babies' booties, 5 babies' bonnets, 1 baby's jacket—Totaling 172 knitted articles in all. Eighteen khaki handkerchiefs were hemmed, and three babies' blankets were blanket stitched. At Christmas time the three boys from the district who were then on active service were remembered with boxes containing too some delicacies baked by these ladies.

In addition to the above this group knit two afghans—donated one to the Red Cross to be forward to the British women on active service, and sold tickets on the second. They also made a quilt and donated it along with a blanket to be sent to the homeless in Britain. During the year this small group of workers with an average attendance of only nine members raised \$71.15, of this amount \$41 was donated to the Red Cross, \$15 to the Queen's Canadian Fund and the balance was used in buying material for quilts and afghans. Plans are underway for this energetic group to carry on their war activities for the coming year under the name of Calvin Church Ladies' Club.

**Believe Reds Burn Tallinn**

HELSINKI, Finland, Aug. 27 — (AP)—The reddish glare of a great fire and the thunder of artillery led Finns today to believe that the Estonian capital of Tallinn, 50 miles south of Helsinki across the Gulf of Finland, was being destroyed by its Russian garrison under heavy fire of German besiegers.

The tremendous glow on the southern horizon, first visible last night, was so intense it still could be seen this morning.

The Finnish press reported that German accounts said three Russian merchant ships totalling 9,000 tons had been sunk by Nazi air attack in the Gulf of Finland and that four others totalling 14,500 tons, two transports and two destroyers had been damaged.

This was taken here to indicate the possibility that the Germans had pounced on a convoy en route from Leningrad to rescue the Tallinn garrison, which apparently was following literally the proclaimed "scorched earth" policy of the Red army.

Tallinn was by-passed early in the war, German forces moving up to the west and then around south and east of the city. The garrison has been supplied by sea.

Of Finland's own part in the war against Russia, a Finnish air communiqué claimed the Russians were being forced out of Viipuri on the Karelian Isthmus by heavy Finnish bombing. Viipuri was lost by Finland in the 1939-40 war with Russia.
