**REGICIDE IN PORTUGAL**

The royal tragedy in Portugal which has just now startled the world, serves as another reminder of the uncertainty of tenure by which kings and rulers hold their lives. They are liable to all the diseases which human flesh is heir to, and with the added peril of assassination to which their exalted position exposes them in much greater degree than persons of humbler station in life. Regicides have been frequent from the days of the earliest kings, but the introduction of democratic institutions has done little to abate the evil. The elected presidents of the United States, France and the South American republics have been quite as frequently struck down by the assassin as have the crowned heads of the monarchies.

Carlos I, King of Portugal, the latest to fall, was comparatively a young man. He was born in 1863, the son of King Louis and his spouse, the Princess Pia, daughter of King Victor Emmanuel of Italy. He was married in 1886 to the Princess Amelia of Orleans, daughter of the Count of Paris, and succeeded to the throne of Portugal in October 1889. His elder son the crown Prince Louis Philippe, Duke of Braganza, who has now also fallen, was born in 1887. The second son and only surviving child of the murdered King, the Prince Manuel Duke of Beja, was born in 1890. He is now in his nineteenth year, and by the death of the King and the Crown Prince has become King, if the succession is perpetuated. The murdered King has also a surviving brother Prince Alphonse Duke of Sperto who was born in 1885 and is unmarried.

Portugal is a small kingdom of only 33,000 square miles—about one quarter larger than New Brunswick—but with a population nearly equal to that of the Dominion of Canada. It has about 5,500,000 people. Four hundred years ago it was one of the most powerful monarchies in Europe and Lisbon one of the most important commercial cities. The kingdom was destined to a swift decline, and since 1820 when Brazil was lost, has counted for little as a factor in the great world's affairs. The news it has supplied since the days of the Peninsular War and at frequent intervals, has been chiefly of internal troubles and earthquake shocks.

For a long time the Government of New Brunswick was a composite affair, made up of both Liberals and Conservatives. The late Government may be said to have been an exception, its former Conservative members having become Liberal. The Sun, which speaks for the Robinson Administration, claims that "it is a straight Liberal Government, in organic union with the Liberal Government, in which every member is an avowed and recognized adherent of the Liberal party of Canada."

**A TUNNEL TO HADES.**

Sir Oliver Lodge, some time a devout scientist, but in recent years devoting his energy and enthusiasm to psychical research and spiritualism, now believes that he has established some sort of reliable communication with the world of departed spirits. As he puts it:

"Like excavators boring a tunnel from opposite ends amid the roar of water and other noises, we are beginning to hear now and again the strokes of the picks of our comrades on the other side. The boundary between the present and future states is still substantial, but it is wearing thin places."

It is easily obvious that Sir Oliver Lodge's tunnelling operations, if there be any chance of completing the work and opening a passage, transcending in importance the Simpson or the Channel tunnel and all subterranean or sub-aqueous excavations hitherto attempted. For ourselves we do not believe that he will succeed, yet we cannot but reflect upon some of the possible consequences should he and the shadowy workers on the other side break through. There is, for example, the awful contingency that he might establish connection with the wrong place. We cannot imagine the happy spirits in Paradise wielding the pick to make their way earthwards, and as to the less fortunate ones on the other side, the thought is not assuring.

In brief, Sir Oliver's proofs of communication so far established, appear to rest upon certain messages which he thinks he has received from Edmund Gurney, Richard Hodgson and F. W. H. Myers, sometime since departed to the other side. These obliging spirits gave more or less evidence of their identity by writing their messages in their own hand, by transmitting a part of each message through the mediumship of Mr. Piper and Mrs. Verrill respectively, the mediums being separated, and the divided fragments fitting together and telling of things known in some cases only to the departed one, or to them and Sir Oliver. He admits that "the proof of identity will usually depend on the memory of trifles." But there are experts in the imitation of hand writing, and that mediums have memories is only too painfully evident. For which reasons among others, including Sir Oliver's enthusiasm, we have our doubts as to the early operation of the Tunnel to Hades.

Toronto proposes to increase the charge for liquor licenses along with the reduction in their number. Down to date the rate has been \$1200 for taverns and \$1,000 for shops. The Ontario Government will now be asked to increase these rates to \$2,000 and \$1,500 respectively.

While the Government in New Brunswick seems now to be organized on avowedly Liberal lines the Opposition are not so exclusive and seem quite willing as heretofore to accept support from any quarter. Both parties claim a triumph in the elections of a month hence, but experience has proved that it is no easy matter to defeat a Government even when it has become apparent that it has held office too long for the country's good.

Toronto Saturday Night, a well-written and popular journal, comes out squarely for abolition of the Senate. It argues that nearly all the Provinces have got rid of their Upper Houses with advantage; that to reduce the number of Senators would be "to down half the kittens and keep the rest," and sums up the matter tersely in three sentences: "We do not require a second representative Chamber, and we should not support one that is misrepresentative. Leave it as it is and it will prove useless; patch it up and it will prove a nuisance. Let's chuck it."
