The Postal Service Then And Now

The following interesting address was delivered by Postmaster J. F. Whear at Rotary Luncheon on Thursday afternoon, April 27th.

THE POSTAL SERVICE

The word Post is an adaptation of the French Poste, a station, position, and the meaning gradually developed so that it came to be applied to the service connected with the delivery of letters, parcels and general services.

The speedy despatch of messages, letters, etc., has come down to us from the earliest times. We read in 11 Chron., 306 "so the posts went with the letters from the King and his Princess through out all Israel and Judah."

"Now my days are swifter than a post," viz a messenger of better carrier and in Jer., 51:31 "The post shall run to meet another" etc. I have recently read in an American Magazine that according to present scientific discoveries 5000 years ago they had an elaborate banking system with a reserve bank, a postal system with a parcel post, and a circulating library.

The importance of the Postal Service cannot be underestimated in considering the development of the country. It is said that of all the executive Departments of the Government the Post Office is the one nearest the people and the one with which they are most familiar.

It is a Department which admits of constant improvement and expansion and I know that our Postmaster General always welcomes clear and correct information respecting arrangements, and also any suggestions which may materially benefit the Service.

No Branch of the Public Service is of higher importance to the business and industrial conditions of our country than the Postal Service. It is the largest Government organization, it reaches the home of every citizen of the land, brings to each house and hamlet of our country news of the day, disseminates knowledge and aids to the up-building of business and commerce throughout the land.

In the United States special efforts put forth from time to time to bring the Postal Service into every close contact with the public. For instance, there are "County Welfare Councils" with the declared object of increasing the efficiency of the Postal Service in the County, of improving working conditions in Post Offices and of effecting closer cooperation and better understanding among the public, the Postmasters and employees of the Postal Service.

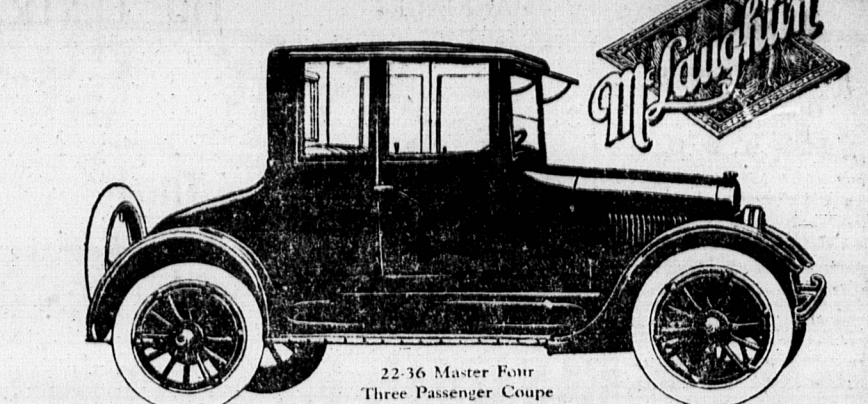
There is to be a Postal Improvement week - May 1st to 6th for better cooperation between the patrons of the offices and the personnel of the system, for the real Postal System of the country includes those who prepare mail for transmission as well as those who are employed in the Postal System proper; and just here I would like to remark that if more care and attention were used in the preparation of mail there would be a decided improvement in the Service. For instance, the address should be correctly and plainly written, letters should be well sealed, bundles of papers or printed matter should be properly wrapped, parcels should be strong, liquid or tied, those containing perishable nature should be put up in accordance with the regulations. Valuable letters should be registered and valuable parcels insured. It is always well to remember that a parcel may be handled several times before it reaches its destination and should be put up so as to withstand this necessary handling. Information and instruction on this and other matters that enter into the daily life of the people might be profitably given in our public schools. A period would be assigned to general information during which material of this nature could be taken up.

ENGLISH PARCELS, ETC. In the administration of the Postal Service, the Department takes cognizance of all laws made for the better government of the people, and so all Sunday work in the post offices is forbidden as far as possible. It is made a misdemeanor to send obscene or indecent matter through the mail, matter of a scurrilous, immoral or seditious nature on post cards, etc. is also forbidden. The mail cannot be made use of to aid in defrauding the public or to aid in the promotion of lotteries and schemes, and further the transportation of intoxicating liquor by mail or mail courier is strictly prohibited.

We have often heard the expression "Post Haste" which means "with the utmost speed" and this indicates the fact that His Majesty's mails or "The Royal Mail" from the earliest times have been carried with great dispatch. It is like the expression "Royal Mail" it indicates the majestic nature of the Service. It impresses us with its prime importance. Parliaments have always held their view and have imposed severe penalties for all offences in violation of the postal laws. It is still true or it should be true, that when carrying mails passengers in a train are not allowed to smoke, and in my opinion this contention is wrong. Mails are first, the passengers, then freight. This is the view that was held when we entered Confederation for our Contract with the Federal Government provided that we were to have efficient steam communication with the mainland winter and summer for Mails and Passengers.

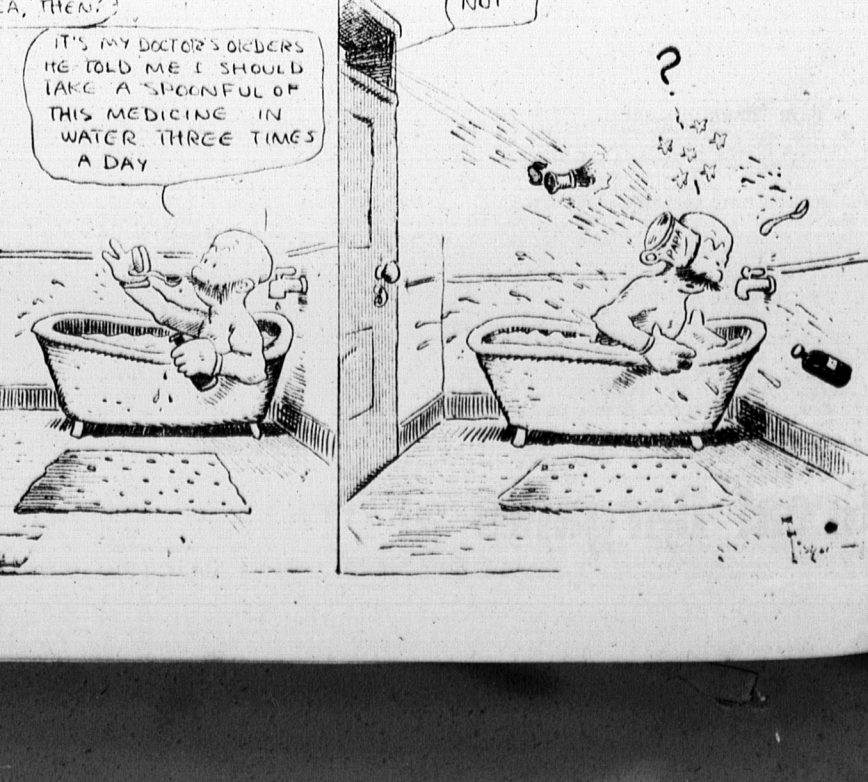
