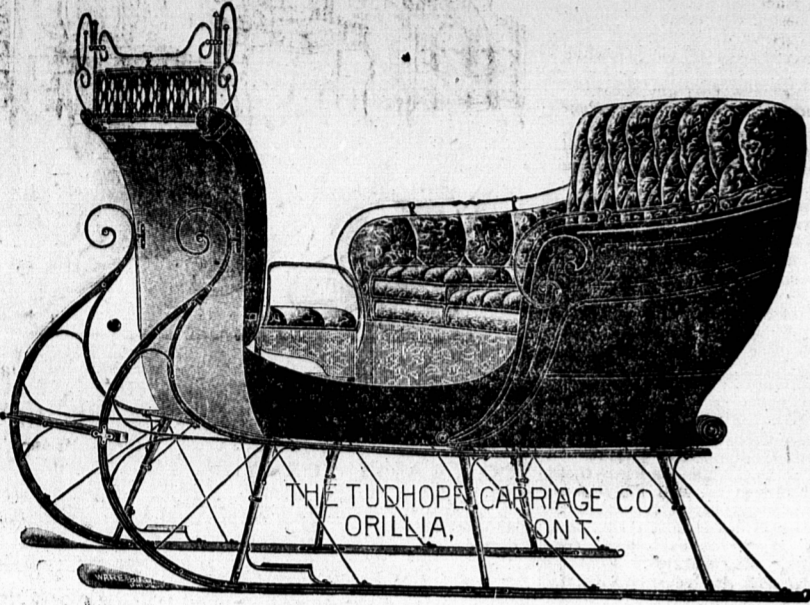

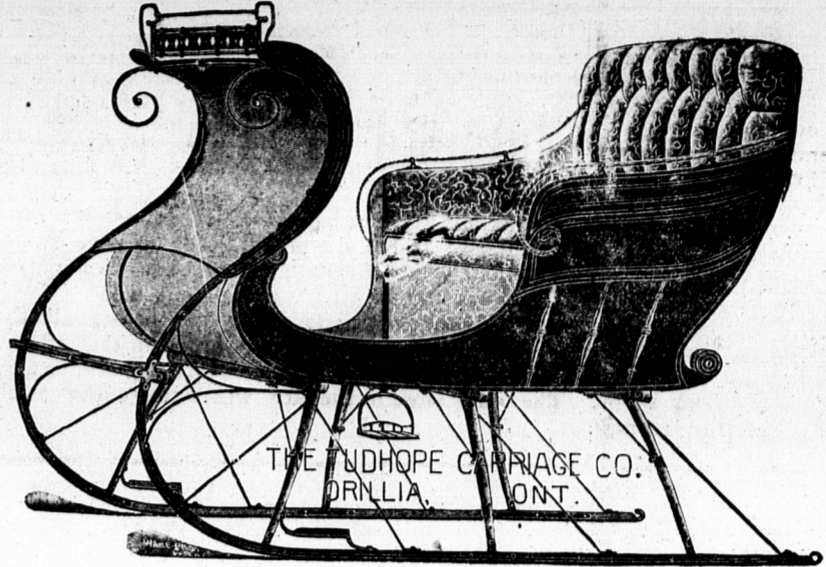

General Description of our Sleighs

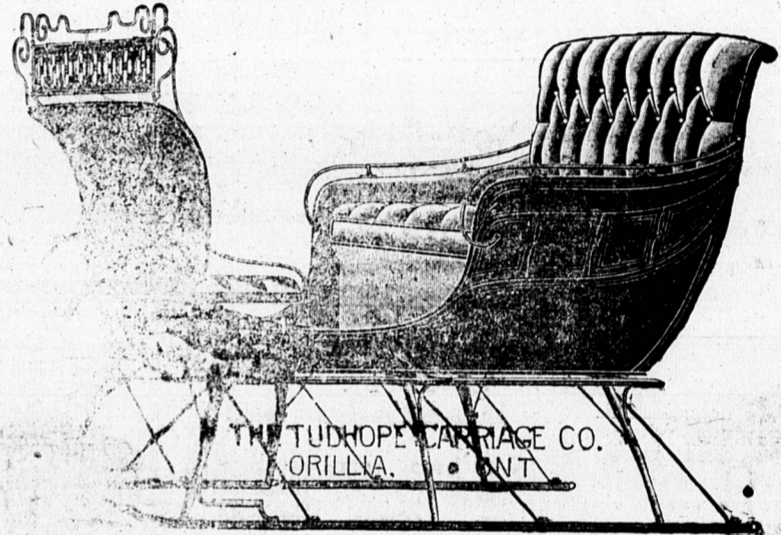
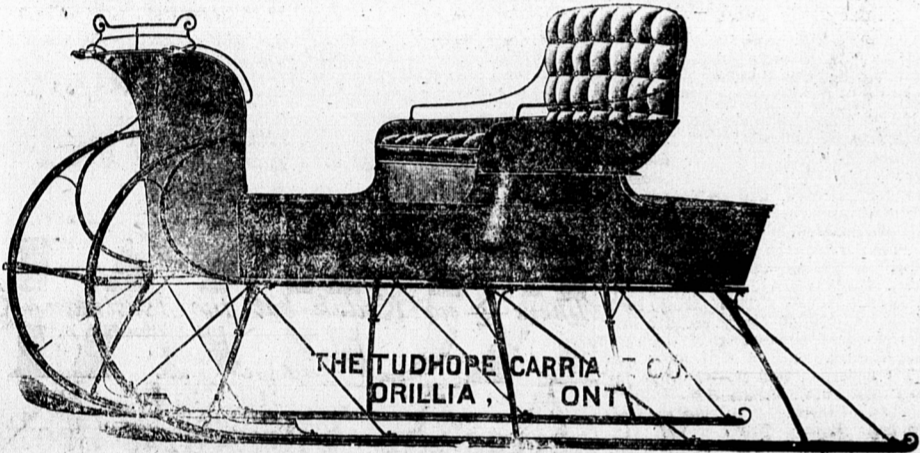
DIMENSIONS—Cushion tops 33 to 37 inches. Backs 20 to 26 inches high from seat bottom; side panels, 10 to 13 inches high [at front post]; height of gears 14 to 20 inches.

WOODWORK—XXX shafts, runners, beams, bent knees and leaders. Bodies moulded as shown. Three ply veneer dashes.

IRONWORK—Steel braces throughout, and flanged channel steel shoeing which runs well up front on 7-8 inch runners.

PAINTING—Bodies: black, red, fancy scrolls and fancy burl. Gears: wine or green, handsomely striped and finished.

Trimming:—High spring backs and sprig cushions, and padded quarters, in plush. Mountings:—Heavy silver dash rails and dash handles, with full length arm rails. Cloth or moquette. Carpet in bottoms and shafts trimmed with leather points. Screen and small seat if desired.

The schooner Alma, Nelson, Capt. Beckman, has arrived at Bonaville from Montague, P. E. I., and the schooner Collector at New York from the same port.

The fish hatchery at Georgetown has been boarded in and has been almost completed with the exception of the shingling of the roof. The building is 70x30, and is erected at the east side of Queen's wharf. J. M. Clark & Co. have the contract, with Alexander Renton, of Georgetown as inspector, and George A. Parker of Georgetown, foreman.

Sch. Diploma, Capt. Lemon, arrived in Montague this week with a cargo of lime stone for H. Peardon.

The following are the market prices in Montague, Dec. 12: twelve cents a lb., geese and ducks ten cents a lb., chickens eight cents. Oats were selling at forty cents a bushel. Butter at twenty-two to twenty-four; eggs at twenty cents per doz, lamb at six to seven per lb., and beef at five to six.
