The situation with regard to Home Rule in Ireland seems to be that while the large Catholic population are almost unanimous in favor of the measure, the Protestant minority are divided. We think it well that the American Senate conducted an investigation into the Titanic disaster. There are four vacancies in the Canadian House of Commons—one each in the Provinces of Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and British Columbia. By-elections must soon follow which may perhaps afford some indication of the drift of political opinion.

By dividing the Massachusetts primaries with President Taft, Colonel Roosevelt has undoubtedly won a moral victory, which can hardly fail to have its effect in the National Convention. But the Republican army, which has divided itself into two sections to fight a terrific battle with itself before engaging with the enemy, must be sadly weakened for the national contest.

An official bulletin from Ottawa tells that of Canada's large grain crop 87 per cent of the wheat, 89 per cent of the oats and 90 per cent of the barley was merchantable. This is a very good showing.
