OBITUARY

Died at Gravenhurst Sanatorium, Feb. 1910, at the age of 22 years, Norman E. Macdonald of Dundas, King's Co. He was in the institution over 12 months, and every thing that science and skill could do was accomplished, but to no avail, and at length he succumbed to the inevitable. A young man of great promise uncommonly muscular, athletic in movements, and military in appearance, standing over six feet and about in proportion, one would think he was a model of strength and health, but that dread disease Tuberculosis was insidiously gnawing at the vitals, the death ended the struggle. He leaves one sister Edna and an uncle Peter Shaw of Dundas, whose death he also mourns. Dr. Kendall, the chief physician was instructed by deceased to send for a clergyman, and the Methodist and Presbyterian Ministers visited him. He expressed the desire to leave all earthly ties and associations and enter upon an untried state of existence, and he with Christ, which is far better, trusting in the mercy of God, through the atonement and the new birth. He gave the attending physician charge of all his effects, together with a purse of some considerable money, and he gave his heart to God. His remains were interred in the City Cemetery, the Methodist clergyman officiating.

MANITOBA ELECTIONS

WILL BE DELAYED.

WINNIPEG, March 20.—The Manitoba legislature prorogued yesterday afternoon after a strenuous session. An election was expected to follow shortly, but it is now thought that the government will wait until the elevator policy is put in force. The bill on this subject, as finally passed, is a compromise with the Grain Growers' Association. The expropriation clause was dropped and the petition of the farmers have been amended to refer only to where the government constructs the elevator.

TO COST MILLIONS.

OTTAWA, March 20.—It was announced by Hon. William Fungley yesterday that the erection of the new departmental building on Sussex Street would be commenced this summer. He said that tenders would be called for as soon as the appropriation of \$300,000 for this year's work had been passed by the House. The new building, which will house all the departments now accommodated in rented buildings, as well as the Supreme and Exchequer Courts and the Railway Commission, will cost between three and four million dollars. It will be 600 feet in length and five or six stories in height.

SHACKLETON WILL BE GUEST OF EARL GREY.

NEW YORK, March 20.—Sir Ernest H. Shackleton will visit Canada as soon after delivering his lecture in Carnegie Hall on March 29 as possible. He will accept Earl Grey's invitation to be his guest during his stay in America. He will give three lectures in Canada, the first in Ottawa under the patronage of the Governor-General, on the evening of April 13. The other two lectures will be given in Montreal and Toronto.

ACCIDENT IN STEEL WORKS.

SYDNEY, March 21.—An explosion occurred at the open hearth furnaces of the Dominion Steel Co. on Saturday. Three men were seriously injured by the flying metal and were severely injured. Superintendent Mackley was the most badly injured. All will recover.

OUTBREAK OF FURY IN PRUSSIAN PARLIAMENT.

BERLIN, March 20.—The third reading of the Prussian franchise reform bill in the Diet yesterday led to an outbreak of fury never before seen within the Diet's decorous precincts. The bill, as finally amended, leaving untouched the system against which the socialists and radicals agitated. Herz Liebknecht, socialist, vehemently denounced the Diet as a den of hucksters, peddlers of old clothes and merchants who had bartered away the rights of the people. This set the House in an uproar, fists being shaken and opprobrious names used. Finally, the bulk of the Conservatives and Catholics dramatically left the House, shouting refusals to listen to further insults.

MAYOR ARRESTED ON FRAUD CHARGE.

RAINY MOUNTAIN, Ont., March 20.—Last evening George Westcott, who only yesterday was a successful candidate for the Mayoralty, was arrested by Provincial officers and jailed at Fort Francis, together with T. Cathcart, of Barwick, charged with importing wolf skins from Minnesota, and coyote skins from Manitoba, and collecting wolf bounty of \$25 per head from the Province of Ontario.

Something like \$4,000 had been collected in wolf bounties by parties in Barwick this season, which aroused suspicion. Last year Westcott was tax collector. The Star Steam Laundry has an appeal to women to send their towels to be laundered. See their ad. on page 4.
