BRONZE CLASP.—General orders issued from military headquarters at Ottawa state that a bronze clasp is to be awarded to all Canadian officers and men who served in France from August the 5th to mid-night of November 22 and 23, 1914. This period covers that of the outbreak of the war until the Germans were checked in their first mad rush for Paris. All men entitled to this clasp which bears the dates of the period are to forward their application to the District Record Officer of the district, who will send their application to Ottawa.

KEEPING FOXES ON P. E. I.—The last issue of the Black Fox Magazine, New York contains the following: We are advised that some few ranchers on P. E. Island believe that it is a mistake to allow their breeding foxes to leave the island. They are talking about placing an embargo on the shipping of live animals to the United States. We are glad to know that only a limited number of Island ranchers are back of this movement, because we feel convinced that if such an action was taken the Islanders themselves and the industry their would in the end be the chief sufferers. One of the principal things that has made the industry on P. E. Island as good as it is today has been the spread of it through the United States. It has been the American demand for foxes that has caused the industry on the Island to flourish. If anything is done to check this or the ranchers have to depend entirely on the sale of pelts a great amount of money will be lost to the Island ranchers. It is too late now to keep the industry confined to the Island, as thousands of foxes from the best Island strains are on American ranches. As it is, it will only be a few years at most before those present American ranchers will be keen competitors of the Island. From our way of looking at it, instead of trying to do anything to restrict or retard the business of selling foxes to Americans, the Island ranchers should be on the lookout to prevent such a thing occurring. We believe a great mistake would be made if any embargo was placed on the sale of breeding foxes from P. E. Island or from any other country. In fact, nothing should be done in any way to check the spread of the industry in any part of the world.
