POTATOES SELL AT TEN CENTS A BUSHEL.
PRESCOTT, Ont., March 15.—A load of potatoes sold here last week for ten cents per bushel. As the price of potatoes was so low last fall many of the farmers buried them in pits, expecting a rise in prices in the spring. A farmer opened his pit and brought in a load and, after trying to sell to different grocers finally sold to a butcher for the above price as feed for his pigs.

LATEST ORDER OF PREMIER STOLYPIN TROUBLES RUSSIA.
ST. PETERSBURG, Russia, March 15.—Premier Stolypin has provoked an indignant outcry throughout the Empire by sending to the Governors and local authorities, a circular in which he says:
"After the promulgation of the law of March 4, 1906, in reference to public societies and organizations, a great movement for popular instruction sprang up.
"As this may lead to the awakening of a conception of national interest I find that the existence and creation of such societies must be checked. You must investigate each request for the authorization of a society and find out if it aims at popular instruction. If so, you must refuse the authorization."
It is indicated by the Premier that the circular applies to "all nationalities except the Great Russians." These latter number 65,000,000, but the population of the whole empire is more than 150,000,000, so that 85,000,000 of the Czar's subjects, including Poles, Georgians, Little Russians, and others, by the caprice of M. Stolypin, will be deprived of their legal rights.
This most amazing of all circulars ever sent out by the Government makes it criminal to instruct great masses of children in their mother tongue, and it seems certain to send thousands of persons to prison and exile.
