SIDE SCHOOL ENROLLMENT - Enrollment in Summerside schools which opened on Tuesday was completed yesterday. Summerside High School registered 710 pupils, an increase of four over last year. This figure does not include those attending the Academy which has 51 students enrolled in grade eleven and ten in grade twelve, a slight decrease in grade grades from last year. St. Mary's Academy enrolled 529 pupils, an increase of 65 over last year. This school accepts girls up to and including grade four.

TINY MARGARET O'BRIEN AND ACE CAST SCORE HIT IN "TENTH AVENUE ANGEL"

The poignant story of a little girl who creates a magic world of her own out of the humdrum atmosphere of a New York tenement district brings that wonder child star, Margaret O'Brien, to the Capitol scene in M-G-M's "Tenth Avenue Angel." It is the story of tiny Flavia Mills, who is content to skate her way down "her" street on one skate, who makes friends with everyone from Mr. Chappell's horse to the blind newsdealer on the corner, who is devoted to her mother and violinist father, and who is "in love" with their roofer, Luke (George Murphy), taxi-driver who has served a sentence in prison rather than turn state's evidence on a gang of young hoodlums with whom he was reared. Another of her fans is pretty Susan Parker (Angela Lansbury), Luke's girl friend, who is tired of his failures and wants to enrich her life. Flavia's outlook makes a dreary world seem like a fairland, but the stark realities of life inevitably intrude on her innocence and she is abruptly brought down to earth when she is falsely accused of a theft. When her mother is subsequently caught in a well-intentioned lie, Flavia is further disillusioned, and when Luke, embittered at his not getting a "break" quarrels with Susan and returns to the company of his former gangster friends, all hope seems lost. But in the end, Flavia's blind faith and goodness of heart work a miracle and she comes once again to love the street on which she has built her dreams.
