STRIKE THREATENED AT KINGSTON, J.A.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Nov. 17—Eighty per cent of all the men employed at trades here gave notice yesterday that they would go out on strike on November 30 because their employers have refused to pay the American union scale of wages. This rate is double the rate now paid in Jamaica. The cost of living is less than half what it is in America.

MET DEATH IN A COBALT MINE

Two Men Fell One Hundred and Twenty-five Feet to Instant Death.

COBALT, Nov. 18—(Special)—At Beaver mine when the men were going down Andrew Osman and John Alia, each aged 25 years were dashed to instant death at the bottom of the shaft.

A heavy cross-head which follows the bucket down, struck in the guides close to the deck and afterwards becoming loose, descended with great force, upsetting the bucket in which the men were descending.

MONCTON, Nov. 18—(Special)—Homer, winner of the Hamilton road race and J. C. Lithgow passed through this city to Halifax from Quebec and Ontario.

Lithgow said he would like to see Moncton in the Nova Scotia Hockey league. He told of a movement to bring several crack English runners to Canada next year to take part in a series of events.

ALBERTA OWNS BIG OIL FIELDS

Hundreds of Square Miles Underlaid With Oil, Coal and Gas. Strong Company is now Engaged in Boring.

CALGARY, Nov. 18—(Special)—Near the surface. Natural gas and oil pour out on the river banks and the bed of streams for a hundred miles. Near Pincher Creek successful oil and gas wells have been bored and the Western Oil and Coal Company which has leased thirteen thousand acres of the more promising land signs that the underlying rock is now active-saturated with petroleum while along the Athabasca River deposits appear gas.

TROUBLE RIFE IN SAINT PIERRE

Over School and Other Questions, British Warship May go Thither. Some People Want Annexation to United States.

ST. JOHN'S, N. F., Nov. 18—(Special)—Despatches from St. Pierre state the situation there is serious. There are only thirty police on the entire island the population of which is five thousand.

Should violence be attempted the British warship Brilliant now in St. John's Harbor will proceed to the French town. France has no warship nearer than the West Indies.

St. Pierre despatches state the crowd which marched to Government House numbered one thousand and also visited the American Consulate.
