NEW YORK, July 14 (AP)—Late bidding for steel, motors and assorted industrial favorites switched the trend in today's stock market and early declines of fractions to a point or so were converted into gains of as much for many leaders at the close.

Canadian stocks were irregular. Distillers Seagrams, International Nickel gained 1-8 and Imperial Tobacco Canada 3-8. Ford of Canada A eased 1-4 as did Lake Shore Mines and Canadian Pacific. Brazilian Traction lost 1-8 each.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up 2 of a point at 37.2, cancelling the loss of the Monday's session. Dealings picked up on the recovery and transfers for the full session totalled 372,600 shares compared with 278,810 the day before.

Among prominent shares in the advancing column was General Motors which edged up 5-8 to a new 1942 top. In front were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, Goodrich, Douglas Aircraft, Oliver Farm Westinghouse, Du Pont, American Can, U.S. Gypsum, Standard Oil (N.J.), Texas Co., American Airlines, Eastern Airlines, Kennecott and Santa Fe.

Utilities did little or nothing and the majority of the rails were able to add only minor fractions.

Down a point or so were Allied Chemical, Johns-Manville, Philip Morris and Dow Chemical.

Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, July 14 (CP)—A part from small groups of industrials and utilities securities backed up in transactions today on the Montreal stock exchange and curb market. Volume was slim.

Price Brothers, Gypsum, Enamel and Heating and Dominion Tar were firmer spots on the stock exchange among industrials but Canadian Car, Doeco "B" and St. Lawrence Paper preferred were in arrears.

Brazilian and Montreal Tramways were ahead in utilities and C.P.R. and Canada Steamship 4 1/2 off down in carriers. Consolidated Smelters dropped to a new low in pivotal metals and International Nickel was also off a shade.

Canadian Cottons, Ogilvie Flour and National Breweries were in the red among miscellaneous issues appearing.

Total sales: 5,100 shares; Industrials, 4,000; Mines, 1,100.

NEW YORK, July 14 (CP)—The Canadian dollar closed 1-16 of a cent higher at a discount of 9 7/8 of a cent in terms of the United States dollar in today's final foreign exchange dealings. (Ottawa Foreign Exchange Control Board rate 99-99 1/2 percent discount.) Unchanged at \$4.04 was the pound Sterling.

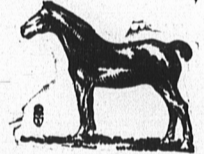

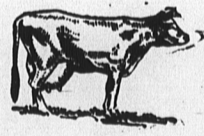
