MONTREAL, Feb. 10 (CP)—Accompanied by mixed news stock market trading slumped today as buyers kept to the sidelines.

A few specialties did better as Howard Smith and Price Brothers preferred, trading for the first time this week, posted two-point gains at 12 and 62, respectively.

Profit taking, however, cut the Lawrence Corporation preferred down 1-2 to 12.

Drops of a point or so each came out in Smeiters and Hudson Bay Mining while Nickel advanced 1-4 to 51 1-4 in a late dribble of demand. Constructions moved forward, with small gains in Algoma Steel, building products and Dominion Bridge.

Behind small amounts in light liquidation were Imperial Oil, Dooco, Canadian Car, Montreal Power and Shawinigan. Frontenac and Brazilian edged higher.

Total sales: 118,800 shares; minuses, 104,200; industrials, 14,600. Bonds, \$950.

Draft Program Of Marketing Co-operation

OTTAWA, Feb. 9 (CP)—A five-point program of marketing co-operation among all branches of the fruit and vegetable industry, from growers to retailers, was approved today by the executive of the Council of Horticultural Producers and Distributors.

The program, drafted by a committee named by a special conference of producers and distributors, will be directed by a national joint council representative of all interests which will guide and co-ordinate the work of provincial committees to be set up.

The new program calls for joint advertising programs and effort to move Canadian produce at all times, concentrated effort to move fruit and vegetables in grant periods, an educational program to eliminate immature fruit and poorly graded products and a concerted effort by all interests to clear up American produce in Canada just prior to the influx of Canadian fruit and vegetables.

Prices Close Steady After Early Decline

BY FREDERICK GARDNER Associated Press Financial Editor NEW YORK, Feb. 10 (AP)—Laid buyers in steel and motors enabled the stock market to regain its stability in part today after a general downward drift throughout the great part of the session.

Turnover of 444,638 shares, compared with 546,720 the day before, was the smallest 5-hour total since Sept. 6, last. The Associated Press average of 60 issues was unchanged at 49.9.

Canadian securities were mixed. Fractionally higher were Dome, International Nickel and Hollinger while Distillers, McIntyre, Inperial Solvents, Southern Pacific and Union Carbide.

Stocks emerging with gains of fractions to around a point included U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, American Telephone, Glenn, March, Sperry, United Aircraft, Consolidated Edison, Sears Roebuck, J. C. Penney, General Goods, Commercial Solvents, Southern Pacific and Union Carbide.

John-Manville dropped 3 1-2 points at 90 1-2, and minor losses were shown for Douglas Aircraft, Westinghouse, U. S. Gypsum, Santa Fe, Standard Oil of N. J., General Electric, American Smelting and Philip Morris.

TORONTO, Feb. 10 (CP)—A mild pick-up in the last 10 minutes cut down losses on the Toronto exchange to about a quarter-point in all index groups. Trading was dull throughout the session and aggregate turnover was only 484,000 shares.

Junior goods had the main call with Stadacona the feature. At the opening the price dropped back to 85 and then pushed along to 98 to close with a net gain of nine cents. Augite moved similarly to show a net gain on good volume. Other penny issues did a little better were Artfield, Brooklyn, Fernlund, Madsen and Kirkland-Hudson Bay.

The close was down 4 to 12 cents for Beattie, Macassa, O'Brien, Crown, Premier, Sigma, Teck and Hudson Bay. Kirkland-Hudson advanced 4 cents.

Smelters finished a point down and fractional losses showed for Hudson Bay and Noranda while Nickel gained a minor fraction. Waite-Amulet picked up a few cents and Bend Oreille finished 4 cents down. Silvers were quiet with Eldorado off 3 cents.

Page-Hershey added 1 1-2 and Steel of Canada 4-4. Imperial Oil closed down in fairly active selling but other senior oils were strong. Home Oil was strong on end, than wiping out an early loss of 6 cents. Calgary-Edmonton and Okalta closed 2 to 3 cents down and Foothills dropped 15 cents. Royalty weakened 1-2.

MONTREAL, Feb. 10 (CP)—Pound Sterling declined 15-32 of a cent on Montreal foreign exchanges today to \$4.70 3-4 while the United States dollar gave up 1-32 to 15-32 premium. French francs firmed slightly to 2.66 1-8 cents.

NEW YORK, Feb. 10 (AP)—Renewal of recent transfers of foreign-held money out of Holland was indicated today by fresh weakness in the Netherlands guilder.

The decline, which affected other leading European monies, was attributed by banking sources to problems arising out of what appears to be the approaching end of the Spanish conflict.

The guilder declined 69 cent to 53.81, the Pound Sterling 1-4 cent to \$4.68 5-8 and the franc .00 1-8 cent to 2.64 3-4 in terms of the United States dollar.
