**Base Metals And Papers Lead Stock Market Drop**

TORONTO, March 16 (CP)—Base metals slid downwards to the lowest levels in 11 months on the Toronto Stock Exchange today in the second successive session of decline since a United States lead producer reduced its price to 18 cents a pound.

Losses broadened out steadily for most of the session although tending to narrow towards the close as selling pressure eased.

The base metals index of selected stocks has declined some four points since last Tuesday.

A wider list of base metals issues dipped in today's trading as selling spread. Sixteen issues touched new lows for the year or more and Consolidated Smelters led the decline with a loss of \$2.50 at \$38, also touching a new low at \$97. International Nickel, Hudson Bay, Noranda, Waite Amulet, Queumont and Pind Orielle were among the steeper losers.

The remainder of the market also moved on a weaker tone for the second successive day. Senior and junior producing goods slipped steadily. Western oils were in a one-day downward movement.

**AT NEW YORK**

NEW YORK, March 16 (AP)—Mild selling whittled away at stock prices in today's market.

At the final bell losses ranged from fractions to a point or more, although most were in the fractional bracket. Late in the day buying interests stepped up a trifle and some of the widest declines were cut.

The decline in early trading soon leveled off but not until the final hour did any resistance show up.

Turnover of 670,000 shares compared with 730,000 yesterday. The limited activity indicated to Wall Street an absence of large-scale selling pressure.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined 1 of one point to 63.2.

Philip Morris reached a new 1948-49 high during the morning but crossed to the minus side soon after news that the directors had voted a quarterly dividend of 50 cents and an extra of \$1 a share. The company previously paid 37 1/2 cents quarterly and the preceding extra was 25 cents last August. The stock closed 1-4 lower at 42 1/4.

**AT MONTREAL**

MONTREAL, March 16 (CP)—Securities continued Tuesday's general down-swing in light dealings on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market today.

Base Metals and Papers led the downward movement with losses of as much as 2 1/2 points. The Utility group was the only one to edge upwards.

Closing averages indicated Utilities ahead 1 and banks unchanged at 27.3. Industrials dipped .7 and golds eased 43 while papers dropped 22.

Of 171 issues traded, 27 were improved, 84 easier and 60 unchanged. Three new highs were established against 25 new lows.

Turnover was light. Industrials were traded on a total turnover of approximately 29,200 shares, a drop of 3,100 shares from the previous session. Mining sales were 137,000 against 163,000 shares Tuesday.

Consolidated Smelters continued to attract attention, but dropped 2 1/2 to 97 1/2 points after touching a new low of 97 in forenoon trading. Noranda was down 1 3/4 at 52, Hudson Bay mining 1-4 at 43-8, aluminum 1-4 at 54 3/4, and Steico,
