THE EARL GREY. - The Earl Grey left Picton Saturday at 7 a.m. for Georgetown and docked at 12.35 p.m. She brought over 50 tons of freight, 30 passengers and 100 sacks mail.

EARL GREY COMING. - Upon enquiry from Captain Taylor it is learned that the steamer Earl Grey will leave Picton tomorrow morning coming direct for Charlottetown if ice permits. This will be good news to the many shippers in this port.
