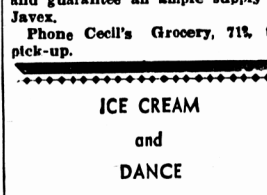

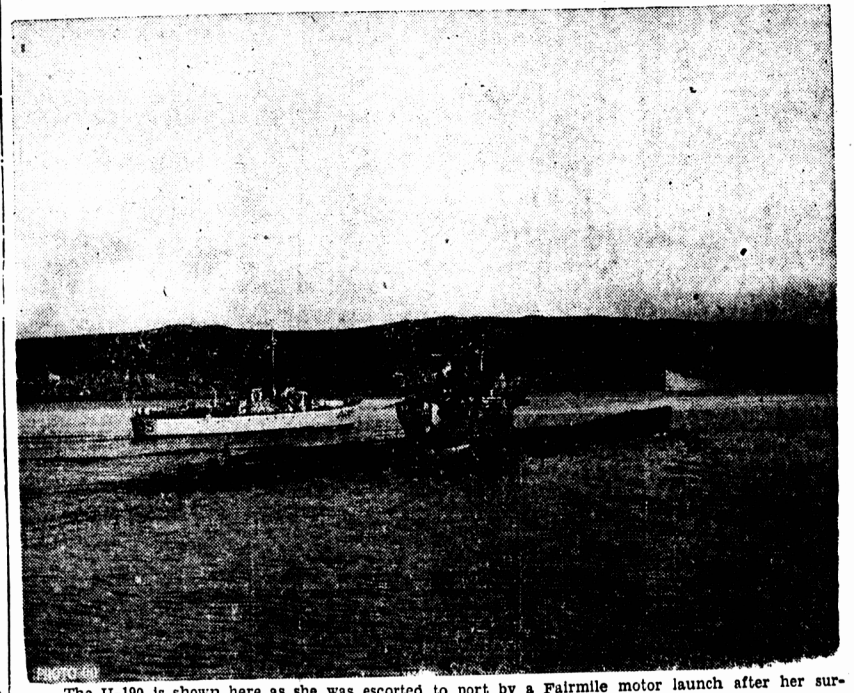

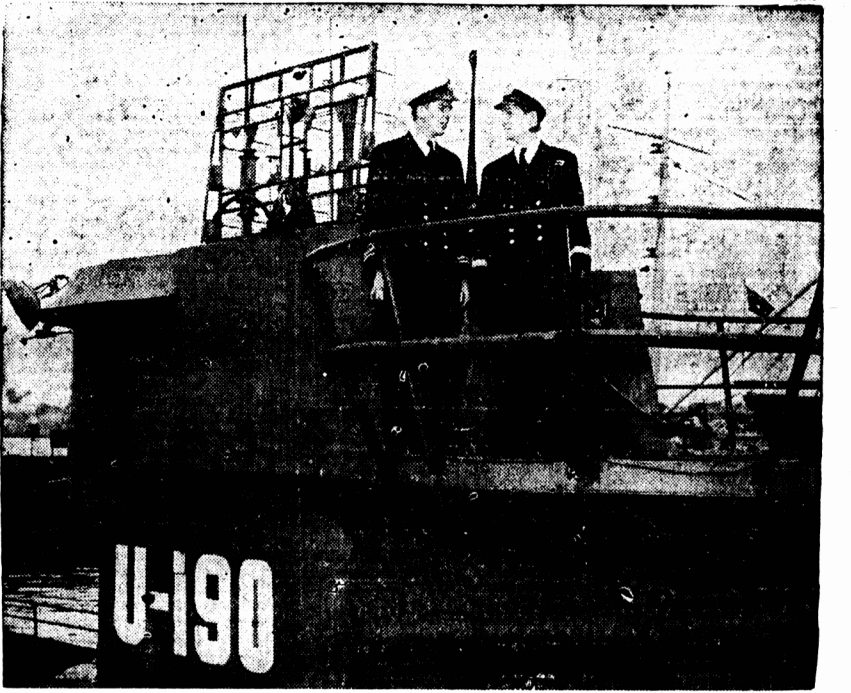

German U-B oat At Halifax Awaits Destruction

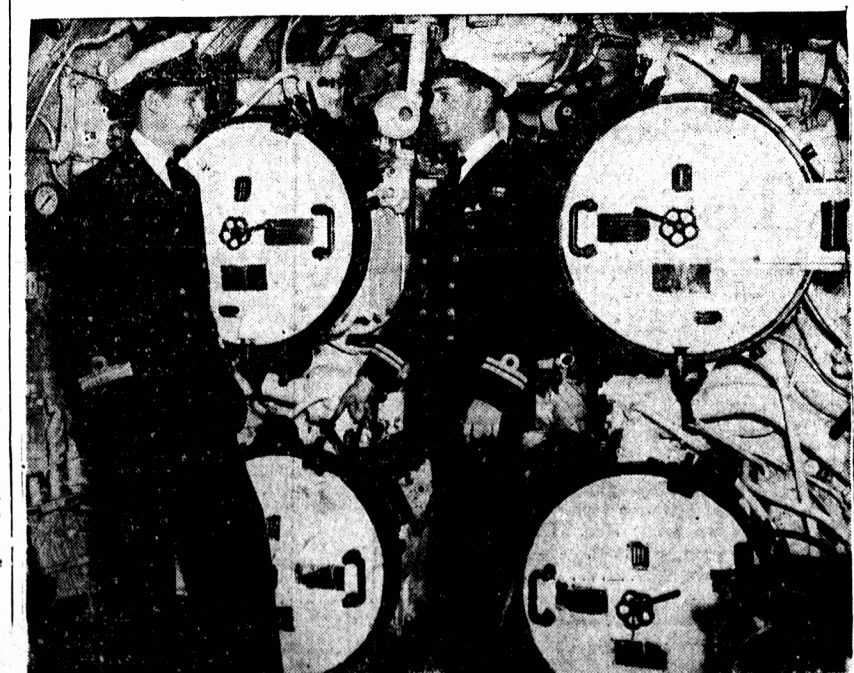
One of the two German submarines which surrendered to Canadian warships on this side of the Atlantic after VE-Day, the U-190 will soon put to sea for the last time. Hon. Brooke Claxton, Minister of National Defence, has announced she will be destroyed in an anti-submarine exercise later this year. Among the ships which were victims of the U-190 during the war was the Canadian minesweeper, H. M. C. S. "Esquimaux," sunk off the entrance of Halifax harbor on April 16, 1945.
